Today's Gospel Reflection

<u>First Reading</u>: Jeremiah 20:7-9 <u>Second Reading</u>: Romans 12:1-2 Gospel: Matthew 16:21-27

Finding God

Does God want us to be happy? How could anyone answer "no?" How could anyone suppose God is good or loving if it is not true that He wants us to be happy?

And yet look at Christ's line in the Gospel reading. "Deny yourself," Jesus tells his faithful followers; "take up your cross and follow me."

Denying yourself seems the very opposite of going for happiness, and the cross is an instrument of torture. Why would God want these things for His people. Does God want us to be *unhappy*?

A man divorcing his unaccomplished, middle-aged, dowdy wife to marry a much younger, prettier, successful woman explained his decision to his devastated wife this way. "God wants us to be happy." he told her, "and I can't be happy with you. I *will* be happy with her."

It seems never to have crossed the mind of this husband that God might have any care for his wife's happiness. The husband's full view of the matter could be put this way: "God wants *me* to be happy, but God doesn't care at all about *you*."

This little story, common in its selfishness, shows the sickness of the post-fall human condition, so apt to privilege its own power or pleasure over any greater goods. We can't be happy in this condition, when we are glad enough to crush others to get what we want. What is to be done with us? What will make us happy? What will save us from the evil that infects us and leaves us so

willing to afflict others?

This is where Christ's line comes in. The route to the happiness of God does want for us has to go through the cross of Christ. Christ is The Way for us, and the cross is where we meet Him for the road to our true happiness in love and holiness in Him.

CALLED TO BE FAITHFUL

Somewhere in every life, along its twisting curving path, we find ourselves wondering if we would not be better off somewhere else doing different, as if with the flip of the channel we could live a parallel life. Except that changing life always is never that simple. And so we live on with our foibles and our insecurities. We make do for one more day in a job that is less than satisfying, or a relationship that is worn and fraying, or caring for aging parents as we juggle the needs of two households. In every niche of life, we may find ourselves dealing with difficult people, listening to other's twose wondering if anyone cares. Like the prophet leremish to



Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

woes, wondering if anyone cares. Like the prophet Jeremiah, we can feel we've been duped by the Lord God.

We don't need to go looking for crosses. They come our way. And it is our crosses that allow us to save our lives by losing our lives. It is these very same lives from which we wish we could escape that brings us to holiness, if for no other reason than that *we* do struggle not to have our own way all the time. Spirituality has been defined as an inner set of values by which we live an outer set of circumstances. As people of faith, we try to do just that: to live in the style of Jesus. Somehow, it seems that God brings us to places we should be.

Dear Padre

Are we supposed to pray a specific prayer after we genuflect and keel in the pew before we take our seats?

What about after Communion?

There is no particular prayer to say when we genuflect, enter the pew, and kneel for a while. Genuflecting and kneeling are powerful expressions and prayers in themselves—we kneel only to God. But these gestures can become



mere routine unless we accompany them with a moment of awareness and recollection and maybe a prayer like, "I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world."

Neither are there required prayers to say in the moments after holy Communion as we return to the pew. But this is a most special time. "Holy souls endeavor to remain as long as possible in prayer after Communion," wrote St. Alphonsus Liguori in The Holy Eucharist. "There is no prayer more agreeable to God, or more profitable to the soul, than that which is made during the thanksgiving after Communion." Eucharist is from the Greek eukharistia, which means "thanksgiving," and this is a time for giving thanks. We remain silently focused on the astonishing passion and affection of our Lord in giving Himself to us to eat and make part of ourselves. So much depends on awareness; so much depends on gratitude. Prayer books may help us enter a time of thanksgiving. But we can also say simply, "Jesus, I love you."

How can I avoid gossiping?



Chatting with friends can become gossip—unfairly disclosing another's faults or sins without a valid reason, to people who don't know them (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2477). Try these ideas when chatting becomes gossip:

Name it: A gentle reminder between friends is an act of kindness. Try, "I think we're edging into gossip; or "Oh, that's not kind!" It's better to risk speaking up than silently allowing sin.

Redirect the conversation: Highlight good qualities of the person about whom others are gossiping. Refocus on inspiring news, a good book you read—anything else that is "honorable...just...pure...pleasing (*Philippians 4:8*).

Leave: If nothing else works, excuse yourself and leave the conversation. You'll avoid becoming complicit to sin and wordlessly communicate that you find gossip unacceptable.

Pray: Sins of the tongue (gossip, slander, calumny, detraction) are serious and require grace to resist. Invoke the Holy Spirit for yourself, for those who engage in gossip, and especially for those harmed by it.
