The Cross Revealing God's Presence in the Poor

Several years ago, in Canada's prairies, a man names Robert Latimer killed his severely-handicapped daughter, Tracy. He put her into the family truck, hooked a tube to the exhaust-emission, sealed the windows and doors, and let her fall asleep. He wasn't malicious in intent. He loved his daughter. In his mind, this was an act of mercy. He couldn't bear to see her suffer any longer. Nobody doubted his sincerity. His daughter was almost totally disabled physically and mentally, lived in constant pain, and there was no favorable prognosis in her getting better or of her pain ever lessening. So he ended her life, as humane as possible. Her death became a huge national story, a drawn-out court battle that lasted for years, ending up in the Supreme Court, and a country-wide moral and religious debate bitterly divided families and communities. The death of this young girl raises an issue we can't agree on today: what's the value of a human life that is severely disabled?

Biblically, the answer is clear: when someone is deemed expendable, he or she becomes the most important person, spiritually, in the community: the stone that is rejected by the builders is the cornerstone for the building. This means that the Tracy Latimers within our lives are a privileged place where the rest of us can experience God.

One of the central revelations of the cross is that there is a very privileged presence of God in the one who is excluded, in the one of whom society says, "better that she should die for the people." Scripture is clear on this: already we see that the prophets emphasize the idea that God has special sympathy for "orphans, widows, and strangers." At that time, these particular groups had the least status, the least power, and were deemed the most expendable. They could be left to die so that society could get on with its more urgent business. The prophets' message was revolutionary: God has a special sympathy for those whom society deems least important and how we treat those persons is the litmus test of our faith, morals, and religiosity.

Jesus takes this a notch further: in His teaching, not only does God have special sympathy for those whom society deems least important and most expendable, but God's very presence is identified with them: "whatsoever you do to the least of these, you do to me!" Jesus identifies God's presence with the outcasts, with the excluded ones, and He tells us that we have a privileged experience of God in our contact with them.

Nowhere is this stated more clearly than in Jesus' death on the cross: the crucified one is the stone rejected by the builders, the one deemed expendable so that normal life will not be disrupted. But the crucified one is also God and there is a special intimacy with God that can be had only in standing, as did Mary and John, near the cross, in solidarity with the crucial one, the one who is being executed. **Precisely within the crucified one is the presence of God.**



Our path to Jesus. We have one mediator in Christ (1 Timothy 2:5).


Yet, what loving son refuses his mother's requests? In His generosity, God is pleased to answer Mary's prayers for us. We can ask Mary to pray with (and for) us:

WHEN GOD DAYDREAMED US

At the end of the Broadway musical *Camelot*, King Artur finds himself confronted by the fact that his dream of the Round Table and justice for all has died without having borne the fruit he had hoped. A young boy, Tom of Warwick, comes up to him asking if he might be dubbed a knight. Arthur does so, and then commissions him to go forth and tell the story of Camelot to everyone he meets, all with the hope that someone someday will dare to try again to create a world with equal justice for all

We all live with dreams of what we might be, of what life might be. They seldom turn out the way we had imagined, yet what would life be without such dreams. They push us into new futures. They create hope and new possibilities. They bring meaning to our lives.

Dear Padre

How is an icon different from a regular painting of a saint?

Generally, *icon* means a symbol or image. In the Church, it refers to an image depicting Bible stories or holy people. "*Icons express in images the same Gospel message that Scripture communicates by words*" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1160).

Even though an icon is an image created with paints, icons are written, not painted. Icon writing, called iconography, is a vocation as well as a talent. The difference between a painter and an iconographer is that iconographers follow strict rules and standards set forth in Eastern Church canon law and Christian tradition. Rooted in God's word, icons are rich in symbolism. The colors, gestures, and shapes speak spiritually to invite us to pray and worship.

Icons can be written on almost any surface, but historically most were written on wood and had a gold-leaf background. One example of this type of icon is Our Mother of Perpetual Help, which is believed to have been written in the fifteenth century. Pope Pius IX gave it to the Redemptorists in 1865, telling the order to "make her known throughout the world." It now hangs in the Church of Saint Alfonso in Rome.



The proper form when receiving Communion is to reply "Amen" after the Eucharistic minister raises the Host or Chalice and pronounces it, "The Body (or Blood) of Christ." By responding this way, you openly state your belief in the presence of Christ in the Eucharistic bread and wine as well as in His Body, the Church.
