Today's Gospel Reflection

First Reading: Isaiah 45: 1, 4-6

Second Reading: Thessalonians 1:1-5b

Gospel: Matthew 22:15-21

The Image

In the Gospel Reading, the Pharisees are trying to trap Jesus into saying something that can be construed as sedition against the Romans. "Shall we give tribute to the Romans," they ask Jesus. Jesus' answer calls attention to the fact that the common currency of the time was Roman and so had Caesar's image stamped on it. The image of Caesar on the coin is an indication that the money is Caesar's. Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, Jesus says, and give to God what is God's.

But the point of Jesus' line is also that each one of us is God's because each of us bears stamped in His soul the image of God.

It is an honor and a glory to us that each one of us without exception is in the image of God. But it is also an awesome responsibility. When the face of a body is disfigured by self-indulgence in food or drinking or smoking, when the face of a soul is twisted by envy or hatred or narcissistic possessiveness, the image of God in that person is warped. When others look at the face of that person they will see only a distortion of God's image.

And so our sins ought to grieve us. Who wants to be a person whose soul shows a distorted image of God?

But the same line of Christ's that leads to this worry and sorrow also gives the consolation for it. Just as Caesar's money belongs to Caesar, so we belong to God. We are His own. The God who made us in His image will not leave us in our sins. Through the redemption of Christ, God will make His image lovely in each one of us.

That is why Scripture says (Romans 8:29, 1 John 3:2) that when Christ comes again, each one of the faithful will be found in the image of Christ.

We wait in hope for that time.



LET'S TAKE A MOMENT... By Tere Hunt



Do you believe in coincidences? Or as others might call it—God's creative designs? Looking back at your existence decades ago, did you ever imagine you would be where you are now? It's often startling to see how events in our lives that at the time appeared to be totally disconnected seem to have stunning—even amazing connections. There lies exceptionally complicated and profound questions of whether it's possible to believe in "providence"—the concept that the God responsible for the creation of this universe might also "arrange" or "direct" human affairs in the everyday realm. I could conceivably trace a line of seemingly casual events of being raised Catholic by Catholic parents coupled with my Catholic education throughout high school and college, spanning a career in communication and law, then led me to a position with St. Jude becoming full circle! That's a stretch, you'd say. I would agree if your point of view sees all of life as a series of entirely accidental and unrelated events. BUT what about a perspective that views life as a series of choices which, when made according to practicing the love of God and neighbor, may over time increase the possibility of ending up with a more fulfilling life? I know that might also seem like another stretch. There are many opportunities for all of us to make good choices, and if one fails, another will come. Yet when we make critical life choices which God allows us to discern, our choices on how to make use or abuse of those gifts and opportunities determines the consequences of our future. You may be wealthy and prominent but unhappy and disappointed due to what you chose. When we make choices according to the "will of God" meaning loving God and our neighbor as ourselves—we may have lesser material rewards but significantly experience abundant personal satisfaction and contentment. The consequences are built into the way God created our world—"providential" coincidences envisioned by God resulting from our free choices. Kinda deep ya?



NIGHT GOGGLES

It was a gathering of longtime friends. The conversation drifted from the shore of one topic to another like leaves bouncing down a river. Eventually the talk bumped up against politics. Because we tended to think alike, it turned to smashing and bashing the opposition—all until someone asked, “*Can you name the wisdom in the others?*” “*There isn’t any,*” came someone’s swift reply. “*But surely there is,*” the questioner persisted. “*No one has all the wisdom, and everyone has some of the wisdom.*” What followed was dumbfounded silence. Truth can do that.



We live in a time when the wisdom on the street, over our backyard fence, and at the coffee pot at work all tend to skew “*You’re only OK if you think the way I do.*” It’s a hard-core bias that surrounds not only politics but also raising children, what constitutes a clean house, and the best way to boil spaghetti. Nothing remains untouched.

When Jesus was challenged about whether or not to pay taxes to Caesar, his response was, “*Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God*” (Matthew 22:21b). In other words, it’s OK to pay taxes to Caesar because even Caesar belongs to God. Everything and everyone does. God’s wisdom finds a home everywhere.

Having faith is a bit like wearing night goggles. We being to see what no one else sees, even though it may be a bit blurry, and what we see is the hand of God at work everywhere, even in the opposition.

Dear Padre

Is it a sin to break the law? It is illegal to use fireworks in my city, but every year I do it anyway. Should I mention this in confession?



Strictly speaking, to break a government law does not automatically constitute the definition of sin, so it needn’t be mentioned in the sacrament of penance. By definition, sin damages (or, with grave sin, destroys) communion with God and the Church (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1472). Some actions may not be objectively destructive to our relationship with God and Church—and therefore are not sinful—but they may affect others. Church members are part of society, which depends on its citizens to abide by the laws. St. Paul encouraged everyone to obey the authorities, for all authority that exists is established by God (see Romans 13:1-7).

Not all sins are equally offensive to God; similarly, not all civil laws are equal in their gravity. To knowingly travel a few miles over the posted speed limit isn’t the same as intentionally starting a fire in a posted area of a forest. The danger is in thinking one’s actions are without consequence. Sensible civil laws are designed to ensure the safety and well-being of citizens, and many municipalities outlaw fireworks because of the hazards they pose.

When any civil law is broken for mere self-indulgence or when breaking the law places others at risk, the act has the potential of constituting the definition of sin. In that case, it would rightfully warrant sacramental reconciliation.

Pope St. John XXIII. *Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli* was born to a poor farming family in Bergamo, Italy. His ordination as a priest in 1904 began a lifetime serving the Church as the bishop's secretary, a military chaplain, cardinal-patriarch of Venice, and finally, as pope. He often visited the poor, the sick and prisoners. He also spent his brief papacy working to improve relations with the Eastern Church. Most remembered for opening the Second Vatican Council, he died in 1963.—*Growing in Faith*
