Light from Light

I have told you this story before, but it bears on Sunday's Lenten readings.

The incident occurred a long time ago, just before I was ordained. I had been chosen to give the Easter Vigil homily at the hugely packed College Church at Saint Louis University. It happened that a huge thunderstorm had struck just the night before. I had watched it through the high plate glass doors of the retreat house. Dark rain pouring down, unexpected volcanic lighting flashes, blistering forth in naked power. Every single smallest detail of the landscape visible for seconds, as if twenty thousand florescent lights had suddenly flashed on and then off again.

This tremendous power dwarfed me. It reminded me of what God had told the prophet: *"Do not look at me directly as I pass by; the sight is too much for your eyes"* (Ex 33:20). In other words, we are too small for such brilliance. I found a much more humane version of light at Easter Virgil. The Easter Candle was lighted from the fire at the back, and the large assembly lit their small tapers gradually from its flames. Since I was in the sanctuary I could witness for the first time this soft light spreading forth from countless miniature candles, combining the crowd into a gentle oneness. Comforting glow made each face a vessel which held deep inside itself the quiet being of the person and of the Lord.

Such a contrast: thunderous power followed by warmth, small light. It enacted the true contrast between God's transcendent greatness—too much for human eyes—and Jesus' quiet love. Jesus absolved wrinkles and crippled legs and unseeing eyes. He is our glimpse of the awe-filled intensity of God-the-infinite, but through our tiny, finite eyes. Jesus is God and also one of us. He is lighting turned into candle glow.

In this transfiguration, Jesus, who was quiet light, reversed himself and showed up as God the infinite fire. My mere encounter with lightning was nothing compared to this.

Why such a transformation?

One appealing speculation would be that at the very center of each bolt of lightning is the same stuff that gently caresses our faulty faces and makes them glow.

God does not extinguish His own light. But He can filter it and offer it to anyone who will look.

LET’S TAKE A MOMENT... By Tere Hunt

Have you ever asked yourself if you are good enough for Christ? Do you measure enough to enter His kingdom, earning the rewards He promised? Too often we wish our story to be perfect, we don’t let others know what’s really going on, and we certainly aren’t praying over it. Maybe we do good deeds—we let people through during traffic, we give money to charities; we say nice things. But we are caught in other things, lost in marriage, neglecting our children—whatsoever our shortfall, we put ourselves on the scale of bad to good on the side closer to bad, and stop there. We’re just not “good enough.” We get stuck that “we are not enough” and we can’t make it up. We just can’t. The Bible is filled with stories of men and women who are broken and who didn’t do righteous things nor live righteous lives. These men were supposed to be great men of God, but they made mistakes too. So perhaps we can find comfort that even if they fell short, then we can too! What was significant was their response. These men understood they needed Christ. We need to say, “I’m not righteous enough, and I need you, Jesus!” That was the prayer of those men. They yearned in that, and so can we. We will never achieve perfection. We can place ourselves on the line, but God’s word tells us that we still fall short. No biblical figure (except Christ) has ever reached the pinnacle of the scale, but we can work to live in God’s word and have faith. Because of His mercy, Christ fills in the gap for us. He gives us grace so we don’t have to be perfect. We can lean on God’s grace for our shortfalls. Keep walking with God and don’t stop pursuing Him even though it’s so hard. Make this our Lenten journey and ask God to save us from peril. “For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor demons, nor things present nor the future, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord” Romans 8:38-39. We are good enough!

TRANSFIGURATIONS IN A MUTILATED WORLD

I've never met anyone who thought today's story in Genesis of Abraham and Isaac to be a good story. Abhorred, they ask, "Why would God test someone by asking him to sacrifice his son?" But what if we change the question and ask, "Why would the Hebrew people include that story in their most holy writings? Why would they tell it over and over?" Because of the ending—that's why. Like a movie we watch over and over even though we know how it ends, we watch it, in part, because the ending is satisfying.

The ending of the Abraham/Isaac story shows God is not interested in death and human sacrifice, contrary to the gods of that time. The God of the Hebrews is a God of Life—that's the surprise ending they love, and they keep telling it over and over lest they forget. For them, the part about the testing is simply a means to that unbelievable ending when God insists upon life, contrary to false gods.

In his poem, "Try to Praise the Mutilated World," Adam Zagajewski writes of life's Godly moments in a world we have mutilated by violence, greed, division, and more. He muses on tender moments when we fall in love, on laughter until our sides hurt, on nature's dazzle, on the sweet taste of wine—all simple moments of a life-giving God transfigured in a mutilated world, for our God insists upon life.

Dear Padre

What are the guidelines for producing a passion play? My pastor said there are special guidelines to follow. What are they?

Please read "Criteria for the Evaluation of Dramatizations of the Passion," issued in 1988 by the Bishops' Committee for Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs of what was then called the National Conference of Catholic Bishops. The document is located at USCCB.org).

Passion plays should emphasize the saving action of Christ's death and resurrection without becoming stumbling blocks to understanding the role of the Jewish people in salvation history. The document warns that "stock ideas, unfortunately can become vividly alive in passion dramatizations. It is all too easy ... to resort to artificial oppositions...to heighten interest or provide sharp contrasts between the characters." We must avoid portraying the Jewish tradition as "a religion of only justice, fear, and legalism with no appeal to the love of God and neighbor."

It is simplistic and incorrect to blame Christ's death on certain historical groups and neglect the complexities of the Gospel portrait and of Christ's life. Christ freely undertook His passion and death because of the sins of all, that all might attain salvation. This is the truth that passion plays should strive to communicate most clearly.
