God's Pleasure in our Action

Eric Liddell, the Olympic runner, whose story is featured in the Oscar-winning movie, *Chariots of Fire*, once made this comment. *"When I run, I feel God's pleasure."* He didn't make this comment lightly. As his biography and *Chariots of Fire* make clear, Eric Liddell, in his quest to win an Olympic gold medal was motivated more by his faith than by his own ego. His faith had him believe that, since God gave him this unique talent, God, not unlike any proud parent, took genuine delight in seeing him use that gift. In his heart, he sensed God was pleased whenever he exercised that talent to its optimum. Moreover, that inner sense that God was happy with his use of his talent filled him, Eric, with a wonderful energy whenever he ran.

Seen from that perspective, we see that the roof and source of his motivation and pleasure in running was, ultimately, not his desire to win gold medals and popular adulation, though clearly no one is immune to these. Rather he was motivated by an inner sense that God had given a special gift, that God wanted him to use that gift to its fullest, and that God was happy when he optimized that gift. Like everyone else who is human, he, no doubt, enjoyed the adulation he received for his successes, but he knew too that the deepest joy he felt in using his gift had its ultimate source in God and not his own ego.

There are valid reasons for anyone who draws energy from his or her work, especially if that work he or she brings in a fair amount of adulation. Our motivations are never completely pure. Indeed, if we are fully honest with ourselves, we have to admit that there is always some degree of self-serving in our service of others. But, mixed as our motives will always be, something else, something much more positive, needs to be factored into this, namely, the fact that God gave us our various talents and that God feels good about us using them.

And this, I believe, is true of us, of everybody. When anyone uses properly the gifts that God gave him or her, God will take pleasure in that. After all, God gave us that gift and that gift was given to us for a reason.

And so should we all. We shouldn't feel guilty for exercising the gifts that God gave us, even though our motivations will never be completely pure. Whenever we use a God-given talent to do something well, God takes pleasure in it...and so too should we.

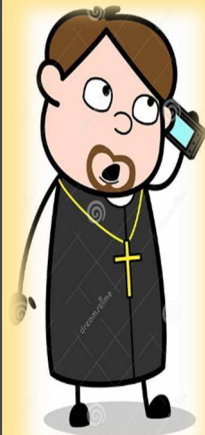

THE SAVING GAME

A long time ago, I came across a piece that I still remember because it's pretty much a commentary on how life is for most of us. It goes something like this: At the age of 10, we think we can live forever. When we're 20, we think we can save the world. When the big 30 rolls around, we think we can save the company. When the 40th birthday arrives, we think we can save our children. Then when we're 50, we think we can at least save our marriage. And by the time we're 60, we think we should just save aluminum cans.

A big flippant perhaps, but it reminds me that even given my own best efforts, I really do not save much of anything. It is always God who does the saving, not me.

It's a conversation replayed in our heads again and again. We find ourselves unwittingly thinking that if we do all the right things, when we die and go to heaven, then God will have to take us in. If we say the right prayers and follow all the rules, then we will have earned salvation. Yet then we will have saved ourselves and there will have been no need for God's gracious goodness. Then we will have lifted ourselves up by our own bootstraps and not by the Lord Jesus.

Then we will proclaim ourselves as the light to overcome darkness, and it will not be the death and resurrection of the Lord which does so.

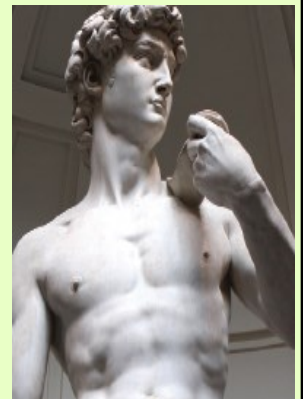
Dear Padre

In the Church's eyes, what constitutes pornography? Art museums have statues of nude men and women, some of which are quite explicit. Is the only difference the respectability of the venue?

The “respectability” of the location or publisher doesn't matter. A product is pornographic if it was created to sexually arouse users of the product regardless of the venue. Michelangelo's intention in carving his famous statue of David was not to arouse the people who look at it, so the Church does not call it pornography.

Pornography has existed for centuries, but it didn't arrive in our homes uninvited until recently. People with internet access are regularly confronted by pornographic images and literature, and many find it a very powerful temptation. In response, the US bishops issued a helpful document, which is available online at usccb.org: *Create in Me a Clean Heart: A Pastoral Response to Pornography*.

From this document: “Using and/or producing pornography is a sin against chastity and against human dignity...The sin of pornography needs the Lord's forgiveness and should be confessed in the sacrament of penance. Pornography objectifies people and brings hurt and pain. It is an illusory substitute for real relationships and intimacy, which in the end bring true joy. Many people struggle with the sin of pornography and [strive] to cultivate chastity. You are not alone. Jesus is with you, the Church offers you love and support. Trust in the Lord's mercy and His power to free and heal you.”

The proper form when receiving Communion is to reply "Amen" AFTER the Eucharistic minister raises the Host or Chalice and pronounces it, "The Body (or Blood) of Christ." By responding this way, you openly state your belief in the presence of Christ in the Eucharistic bread and wine as well as in His Body, the Church.

WHAT IS THE CHRISM MASS?

Chrism Mass should not be confused with Christmas. The Chrism Mass is a religious service held during Holy Week, and is celebrated at the cathedral church of the diocese which for Oahu is at St. Therese Co-Cathedral Church, presided by Bishop Larry Silva. All of the priests gather together and during the ceremony, Bishop will consecrate the sacred oils used in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Anointing of the Sick and Holy Orders. Each parish receives its annual supply of these oils at said Mass. The Chrism Mass is concelebrated with other priests and is the principal manifestation of the fullness of the Bishop's priesthood and considered a sign of the close bond of the priests with him, and meant to strengthen ties uniting all parishes under the guidance of its local shepherd. All lay people are encouraged to attend this beautiful liturgy and witness an important tradition in the life of our churches. **Mass schedule appears on 2nd page.**
