Three weeks ago, a beloved family friend passed. A timid soul, her most significant contribution was the unwavering support to my mother during her periods of chemotherapy when we were not around since she lived on the mainland. Pilar was a devoted nursemaid, providing constant comfort and nourishment during mom’s severe bouts of nausea, diarrhea and mental fatigue. She stayed even after mom’s remission; however, years later, when Pilar’s health started deteriorating, their roles reversed. Mom now in her 90’s reverted back to her nurse’s training and tended to Pilar who was in her 80’s. Frail yet determined to keep vigil, mom sustained a broken rib, accidentally losing her balance while reaching for the blinds by Pilar’s bed, but remained attentive to Pilar even with a bruised hand. Before Pilar’s health declined, I would innumerable catch her poring over sheets of paper, deep in concentration, quietly scribbling intermittently, interrupted only when housework ensued. Once out of earshot, I’d steal a glance at the heap and recognized the valuable pile she had meticulously collected. Crossword puzzles! So thrilled we shared the same interest! Through the years, I would save the newspapers containing crossword puzzles discarded from our office lounge, tackling the puzzles myself on the bus, snipping the extra copies then setting them aside like valuable coupons. Pilar will have a blast solving unabridged Hawaii versions! I have since visited my mom several times, and with each visit, Pilar’s health worsened. Thenceforth while disposing old magazines, I unearthed an odd stack which took my breath away. My pile of cut-out crossword puzzles stared back at me. I must have tucked them away but never managed to present them to her! Pilar died on March 10th, and though a kindred spirit agonizingly left this world, I fancied she welcomed our secret connection. I really thought there was still spare time for me to share something that would bring joy to her ravaged face. Please don’t wait ages to show you care...life is too short to build a mountain out of sheets!

DIocese of Honolulu LENTEN REGULATIONS



FASTING

Catholics ages 18 through 59 are bound to fast on both Ash Wednesday (**March 5, 2025**), and Good Friday (**April 18, 2025**). To *fast* means to consume one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink between meals (except for water and medicine) is not permitted on days of fasting.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT

Catholics ages 14 and up are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday. To *abstain* means at least to refrain from eating beef, veal, pork, or poultry. Eggs and milk products are acceptable. The consumption of fish and shellfish is permitted, though the penitential character of the abstinence should be kept in mind.

EASTER DUTY

Fully initiated Catholics are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept is to be fulfilled during the Easter season, or for a just cause, at some other time during the year. This period is extended to include all the weeks of Lent and Easter up to Trinity Sunday (**June 15, 2025**).

LENTEN PRACTICES

The faithful are encouraged during Lent to attend daily Mass, receive Holy Communion, participate in penance services, and receive sacramental absolution; to take part in public and private exercises of piety, give generously to works of religion and charity, perform acts of kindness toward the sick, aged, and the poor; to practice voluntary self-denial, especially regarding food, drink, and worldly amusements; and to pray more fervently, particularly the intentions of the Holy Father.
