We also celebrated what has been the most pleasant of traditions organized by the Vocation Ministry, a devotional hour for Mother Mary culminating with her crowning. It is a Catholic custom to acknowledge and honor the holy life of our Blessed Virgin Mother in May by offering her flowers. 

* On March 29, 1882, while an assistant pastor at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, CT, Fr. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus with a small group of parishioners, to serve as a mutual aid society and fraternal insurance organization, particularly for immigrants and their families. The organization provided financial assistance in the event of the men's deaths, to their widows and orphans. Through the 20th century, it developed as the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization.

Pope Boniface VIII proclaimed the 1st Christian Jubilee in A.D. 1300, granting full remission of sin for those who confessed their sins and made a pilgrimage to St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. The Church celebrated jubilee years every 100 years, but eventually shortened to every 50 years and then every 25 years. Jubilee 2025 was proclaimed by Pope Francis. The jubilee begins in Rome on the vigil of the Lord's Nativity on 12/24/24 with the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica and will conclude in local dioceses the following

Holy Family Sunday on 12/28/2025, and in Rome on the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, January 6, 2026, with the closing of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica.

The Diocese of Honolulu's **Jubilee Cross** stands in the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa in Honolulu for the veneration of all faithful. To allow a greater participation, Bishop Larry has commissioned a traveling Jubilee Cross that would be hosted by every parish in the diocese throughout the year. **St. Jude will house the Traveling Jubilee Cross from Friday, May 30th through Thursday, June 5th.**

Having the Jubilee Cross will encourage people to make a pilgrimage to our church and *receive the Jubilee Indulgence!* Jubilee indulgence may be obtained by visiting/venerating the Jubilee Cross when the ordinary conditions are met, namely, detachment from sin, sacramental confession, reception of Holy Communion, and prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father, with one Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be.

We will hold a Welcoming of Jubilee Cross on Friday, May 30th at 10am. Details to be determined.

The Traveling Jubilee Cross has features that will catch your eye. It's height is more than 8 feet tall, with black and gold color scheme and stained glass that sets off 11 intricate icons.

"The Cross of Christ remains the anchor of salvation; a sign of hope that does not disappoint because it is founded on the love of God, merciful and faithful."

Rosary Making Ministry

Grandma Pele Stevens and Mrs. Vickie Burke were the first two ladies to introduce us to rosary making in the 1980s. But it was not until April of 2014 that we introduced the art to several parishioners who were interested in learning to make the simple cord and bead knotted mission rosaries.

We remain a small group and up until March of 2020 (pre-Covid 19), we diligently produced at least 500-600 rosaries a month. The rosaries were mailed to different missions, prisons and outreach ministries here at home, all over the United States and the world with the help of OUR LADY ROSARY MAKERS (OLRM), an organization based in Kentucky from which we purchase our supplies at very reasonable prices. The supplies are very affordable, so OLRM strongly suggests that the rosaries not be sold but donated to those in need.

St. Jude's Rosary Making ministry meets once a month on the fourth Saturday from 3:30 – 4:30 pm in the MPR. Members buy their own supplies and donate their time and talent to making the rosaries. This is when we teach newcomers how to make them, give them the information they

Adults and young adults are welcome to join us when we resume meetings this year. Our meetings are on the church calendar and announcements are listed in the bulletin. More on Geri Tong

Geri Tong was born and raised on Oahu. She attended St. Theresa's, St. Francis, Chaminade and UH Manoa. She majored in English and Elementary Education with additional interest in Art. She taught at St. Patrick Kaimuki, Nanakuli Elementary, Waipahu Elementary, Aiea Elementary, Mauka Lani Elementary and Kapolei Elementary. She retired from Kapolei High School as Counselor Clerk. With

her great interest in the arts and crafts, her maternal grandmother taught her tatting, embroidery, and crochet. She provided the crochet leis for St. Jude which were handed out to visitors and birthday celebrants. Geri's mother taught her hand and machine-sewing. Yet she was self-taught in beading on silk cord, using jade, quarts, cloissone, and onyx beads. Grandma Pele Stevens and Vicky Burke recruited her to join the Religious Ed Program at Barber's Point and St. Jude, which were held at Makakilo Elementary Cafeteria and later at the Makakilo Rec Center. It was when both Grandma Pele and Vicky taught her rosary-making that Geri's ministry flourished engaging church volunteers to provide hundreds of rosaries continuously. "Like grandmother and mother, I've always felt drawn to our Blessed Lady for her humility, gentleness, strength and patience coupled with her quest for World Peace. I wanted to teach others the art of rosary-making and formally started the ministry in 2014. Members come and go as time/life permits, but the devotion of each person has been so genuine and so beneficial to others and themselves."
