



Ascension of the Lord & Stewardship in Action

In 2003 while on Active Duty serving in the Navy, I was assigned as the Deputy Commander of an Army Brigade. This was my first assignment in Hawaii and my second of three Joint Service assignments. In early 2004, I found a home in Kapolei and moved in. As I started looking for a new church, I didn't realize that I drove past St Jude everyday while transiting on H-1 back and forth to Wheeler/Schofield. What a surprise!

Once I found St Jude, I joined the Parish and was very happy to find such a warm and welcoming church! During my three year tour I was able to assist in a few vocations as I wanted to do more than just attend Mass. I was fortunate enough that I was able to assist the very talented Confirmation Class Catechists. I wasn't a teacher, just someone who could help with running the class. After my three-year tour, I was assigned off island for about four years and after that was fortunate in being assigned again to Hawaii. This time it is was with the Navy on the Admiral's Staff at Pacific Fleet Headquarters. Since I was able to keep my home while stationed off-island, I was excited to get back home and back to St Jude. The Navy kept me pretty busy so I wasn't able to volunteer as I had the previous time. Attending weekly Mass was great even if that was all I could manage at that time.

At the end of my three-year tour I was again assigned off-island. After completing 30 years, I retired and returned to full time living in Kapolei. Again, it was great being back at St Jude and this time I found the <u>Bible Study</u> group that meets every Thursday evening. I have been attending Bible Study ever since and am so glad I started going. Even as a life long practicing Catholic, there were so many things I didn't know or had simply forgotten along the way.

Deacon Will is a wealth of information and history! His knowledge of the faith and traditions make learning so meaningful. I can tell you that everyone who attends also adds to the learning. Everyone comes with their own thoughts, background and understanding. Their questions discussions open up areas of understanding I didn't know existed. Not everyone can come or commit to attending every class or study, but as Deacon Will states if you can only attend one class you will leave with greater understanding. I can attest to that!! Since joining in 2017, we have studied many parts of the Bible. Every class I learn something that deepens my understanding and faith. Please join us if you can, even if it's just once or twice every so often. You'll be amazed! It's also a great way to meet other Parish members and develop friendships you wouldn't otherwise get the opportunity to do as all of us have different Mass schedules.

The Bible Study also led me to two other areas I would like to mention. The first is a group of pilgrims, led by Deacon Will, who go on religious pilgrimages. I have been fortunate to visit many holy sites that bring the Bible and our faith alive! Not an official St Jude sanctioned group, but many St Jude members go on these pilgrimages along with others from other churches in Hawaii and elsewhere.

The second area is the <u>Senior Box</u> which supplements the Food Pantry here at St Jude. Every second Wednesday we provide needed food boxes to our Kupuna. I have had the privilege since 2018 of joining a great bunch of dedicated Parishioners helping our Kupuna. I am just a small cog in the machine for sure! But it's a well run machine led by Judy, Pat, and Brigida along with my teammates Christine and Terry. As the Senior Box starts at 11:00, not every one can help. I am

In 1986, **Captain George DeVries** was commissioned as an Ensign in the US Navy via the Officer Candidate School in Newport, RI. In November 2015, Captain DeVries retired after 30 years of service.

As Captain, he served as Commander, DISA Field Activity (a major joint IT/Communications command), Comptroller US Pacific Fleet and Deputy Commander for Fleet Support at the Naval Supply Systems Command. Additional sea and operational tours include USS ESSEX (LHD-2), USS FRANCIS HAMMOND (FF-1067), USS LOCKWOOD (FF-1064), Joint Task Force Middle East (Persian Gulf AOR and in USS LaSalle command ship), and Deputy Commander 599th SDDC Brigade. Captain DeVries has deployed in support of OEF, OIF, Desert Storm, Desert Shield and in support of Coast Guard Special Operations.

His additional shore assignments include Operational Navy staff (N62) supporting tactical and non-tactical command and control systems. Captain DeVries has two Masters Degrees, one in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Navy War College and another in Physical Sciences (IT) from the Naval Postgraduate School. He also attended the Joint Services Senior Staff College.

Captain DeVries is designated a Joint Service Officer (JSO), a qualified Surface Warfare Officer (SWO) and an Acquisition Professional. His sub specialties include Information Technology and Financial Management.

Captain DeVries's awards include Legion of Merit (2 awards), Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (3 awards), Joint Commendation Medal, Navy Commendation Medal (3 awards), Army Commendation Medal and various campaign/Sea/unit ribbons.

God's Pleasure In Our Action

In the six months I underwent treatment for cancer, I was working on a reduced schedule. The medical treatments, while somewhat debilitating, left me still enough health and energy to carry on the administrative duties in my present ministry, but they didn't allow me any extra energy to teach classes or to offer any lectures, workshops, or retreats at outside venues, something I normally do.

I joked with my family and friends that I was "under house arrest"; but I was so grateful for the energy that I still had that my inability to teach and give lectures was not a sacrifice. I was focused on staying healthy, and the health that I was given was something I appreciated as a great grace.

A month later, the medical treatments ended and soon after, most of my normal energies returned and I resumed a normal schedule that included again teaching a classroom. Having been on the sidelines for a half year left me a little nervous as I entered the classroom for my first 3-hour session. My nervousness passed quickly as the class robustly engaged the topic and, after the 3 hours I walked out of the class feeling wonderful energy that I hadn't felt for 6 months. Teaching lifted both my heart and my body in a way that it hadn't been lifted in months. It was the missing tonic.

I am not alone with these questions. They are valid for anyone who draws energy from his or her work, especially if because of that work, he or she drinks a fair amount of adulation. Our motivations are never completely pure. Indeed, if we are fully honest with ourselves, we have to admit that there is always some degree of self-serving in our service of others. But, mixed as our motives will always be, something much more positive, needs to be factored into this, namely the fact that God gave us our various talents and that God feels good about us using them.



Eric Liddel, the Olympic runner, whose story is featured in the Oscar-winning movie, <u>Chariots of Fire</u>, once made this comment: "When I run, I feel God's pleasure." He didn't make this comment lightly. As his biography and Chariots of Fire make clear, Eric Liddell, in his quest to win an Olympic gold medal, was motivated more by his faith than by his own ego. His faith had him believe that, since God gave him this unique talent, God, not unlike any proud parent, took a genuine delight in seeing him use that gift. In his heart he sensed that God was pleased whenever he exercised that talent to its optimum. Moreover, that inner sense that God was happy with his use of his talent filled him, Eric, with a wonderful energy whenever he ran.

Like everyone else who is human, he, no doubt, enjoyed the adulation he received for his successes, but he know too that the deepest joy he felt in using his gift had its ultimate source in God and not his own ego. And this, I believe, is true for everybody of us. When anyone uses properly the gifts that God gave him or her, God will take pleasure in that. After all God gave us that gift and that gift was given to us for a reason.

Not long after I felt that burst of pleasure and energy from again teaching inside a classroom, I was talking to a colleague, a very gifted young teacher just beginning his teaching career. He shared about how much he enjoys teaching but how he worries to that the pleasure he derives from it is somehow too much connected to his ego. I gave him the Liddell quote, assuring him that, whenever he teaches well, God takes pleasure in it. He much appreciated Liddell's comment.

And so should we all. We should not feel guilty for exercising the gifts that God gave us, even though our motivations will never be completely pure. Whenever we use God-given talent to do something well, God takes pleasure in it...and so too should we.
