Because we are such chronic worriers, we are so overly confident that we can handle everything on our own. We even convince others that our love and faith in God is enough to cast out all fear. However, being overly confident can become a trap where it ripens to a false sense of confidence. You fall into taking God's love for granted. We lose the passion with regard to our relationship with God. Indifference or coldness, a spiritual unresponsiveness of being overly selfassured that God will always be there, losing that earnest humility and modesty which should be our primary behavior. Remember when you prayed with such intensity and sincerity that your commitment felt so strong, so connected, and unwavering? If the level of fervor and enthusiasm appears clouded, dismissive and somewhat lazy—yes idle, then how useful are we to those in despair when you simply brush off their sorrow with a candid "God will always provide" attitude? We don't realize that by putting less significance on our actions, we commit apathy, a conduct that carries the same grievance as other sins. Christ's profound example illustrates that it is also a sin when we fail to do what we should do. Is our will more important in the lives of those in our church, or is doing what He thinks most important? God's will must prevail, it must always be first for we are His followers, His extension on earth, set apart by our love and commitment to God. We are called to live up to a higher standard. He desires more from us because He cares infinitely more for us. "Behold what manner of love the Father has bestowed on us, that we should be called children of God!" 1 John 3:1.





Pentecost Sunday & Stewardship in Action

My life started in San Pedro, California, where I was born and baptized at Mary Star of the Sea Church. I attended first through third grade at Mary Star of the Sea School and received my first holy Communion at the same location.

I grew up with and still have a close-knit family: Dad and Mom (rest in peace) and three sisters.

My sisters and I were raised in the Catholic faith and attended Mass and catechism regularly. I was confirmed at Mary Star of the Sea Church in Oxnard, CA, while in junior high. I also attended and graduated at Santa Clara High School in Oxnard, CA, which is a Catholic high school.

I guess you can say I am a "cradle Catholic." Growing up Catholic is a blessing and has stuck with me through thick and thin.

I always wanted to get married and have a family of my own, like the one I grew up in. When I was 30 years-old and living in Thousand Oaks, CA, my prayers were answered and God brought *Derek Wong*, who was a non-Catholic and had no denomination, into my life. We dated for three months and were engaged with full approval from Dad and Mom.

We contacted the local Catholic church and were told that before we even entertain securing a wedding date, Derek would need to get his prior marriage annulled. I felt, "Why me?" I knew he had a prior marriage, that I was in good standing with the church and that annulments took forever. As a result, despite my upbringing, I felt rejected and turned away from the Catholic Church. We had a Christian wedding and subsequently two children, Robert and Kela.

Although we were not married in the Catholic Church, I wanted to have the kids baptized Catholic — it's what my parents did. We were allowed to have our babies baptized Catholic as long as we and their respective godparents promised to raise the children in the Catholic faith. So, being the one with the Catholic upbringing, I did. I would take the kids with me to church on Sundays as much as I could, enrolled them in catechism and always prayed that Derek would come to church with us. I believe the Holy Spirit was always there guiding me despite feeling sorry for myself and turning away from the church.

Fast forward to 2017, and Derek was experiencing some health concerns. God answered my prayers and Derek began coming to Mass with me on Sundays. Soon after, I shared that he could learn more about the Catholic faith through adult religious education. During this time our pastor, Fr. Khanh Hoang, provided guidance and Derek's prior marriage was annulled. Derek received his sacraments of initiation, our marriage was evaluated and we received the sacrament of marriage.

Prayer is powerful: God again answered my prayer and my husband's health concerns are under control.

God answered my prayers twofold: I asked Him to guide Derek to go to church with his family for the sake of our kids. Instead, God guided us to the Diaconate. We went to the inquiry weekend, registered in 2018, and together, we answered the call. Derek was ordained in January 2024 and I am the wife of a deacon. While we were in diaconate formation, I retired in 2021 from working in the utility industry. God has a plan for everyone. We are His instruments.

As I continue to share my spiritual journey, I am called to serve others who may have questions, need guidance or want help with the annulment process or marriage validation and receiving the sacrament of marriage. I am passionate about this ministry and I believe my previous work and personal experience can help others.

Being a deacon's wife is not how many ministries or councils you can participate in; it is about being a supportive partner as he fulfills his ministry, teamwork and communication, while balancing and upholding family and home, and also continuing to embrace my personal faith.

Deep down, I really never turned away from my deeprooted Catholic upbringing. I continued to pray and chat with God and He answered. Perseverance in prayer is key. Trust in God's guidance and embrace the journey with an open heart.











Catholic End-of-Life Care: A Journey of Faith, Hope, and Love By Dcn. Raul Perez

As Catholics, we are called to embrace the gift of life from conception to natural death. In today's world of advanced medical technology and complex treatment options, many families find themselves facing difficult decisions about end-of-life care for a loved one. During these sacred moments, our faith provides not only guidance but also profound hope.

<u>The Dignity of the Human Person</u>. The Catholic Church teaches that every human life possesses inherent dignity because we are created in the image and likeness of God. This dignity is not diminished by illness, disability, or the approach of death.

In fact, the final stages of life can be a time of deep spiritual growth, healing, and grace. Our responsibility as Christians is to accompany one another with compassion, reverence, and prayerful presence.

<u>Ordinary vs. Extraordinary Means</u>. The Church helps us distinguish between <u>ordinary</u> and <u>extraordinary</u> medical treatments. Ordinary means—such as food, water, pain relief, and basic comfort care—should generally be provided, as they support life without excessive burden. Extraordinary means, on the other hand, may be withheld or withdrawn if they offer little hope of benefit or impose significant pain, suffering, or financial hardship. This is not a rejection of life, but a recognition that death is a natural part of our earthly journey.

<u>The Role of the Sacraments</u>. As a person nears the end of life, the Sacraments become powerful sources of grace. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick strengthens the soul and body, bringing peace and courage. The Eucharist, offered as *Viaticum*—"food for the journey"—unites the dying with the Lord who conquered death. Confession offers the opportunity for reconciliation and healing.

<u>Assisted Suicide and Euthanasia</u>. Since our state has legalized assisted suicide, the Church affirms that taking a human life—no matter how well-intentioned—is morally wrong. We are not the authors of life, and we must never act deliberately to cause death. True compassion means walking with those who suffer, not eliminating the sufferer.

<u>A Ministry of Presence</u>. End-of-life care is not just about medical decisions—it is a ministry of love. Whether it's holding a hand, offering a prayer, or simply sitting in silence, we reflect Christ's love when we are present with those who are dying. Families, friends, clergy, and chaplains all play vital roles in accompanying the dying person with dignity and peace.

<u>Preparing for the Journey.</u> We encourage all parishioners to reflect on their values and prepare advance health care directives consistent with Catholic teaching. Having conversations with loved ones, choosing a health care proxy, and receiving spiritual guidance now can be a great gift to your family later.

Let us continue to be a people of life—honoring the sacredness of every human life, offering hope in the face of suffering, and trusting in the promise of eternal life through Jesus Christ.
