

I always considered my father a devout Catholic, ensuring his family followed the same principles he grew up advocating. He came from a religious family too—I vaguely remember him mention that I had an uncle that one time entered the priesthood. So it was no surprise that my sister and I were enrolled in Catholic institutions all the way to college, assuring we received the necessary sacraments. My mom also observed First Fridays, First Saturdays, Wednesday Novenasno exceptions—even trudging to church in the gusty rain, electricity down, gripping a near-toppled umbrella, praying desperately that we not get struck by lightning. We enjoyed luncheons with pastors, visits with local seminarians, collected Mass offerings, performed with the choir—actively involved in religious movements and retreats and kept in close contact with the clergy. When the family went on cross country road trips, it was imperative that we visited several churches and basilicas—that's probably why I am drawn to old cathedrals. In his late 70's, my father joined the Knights of Columbus, completely immersing himself in its rigors, subsequently attaining a 4th degree title. It was there that I witnessed one of his finest moments, dedicating a whole hour standing at attention in full ceremonial attire, keeping watch during the entire funeral service, often times struggling to remain upright, the weight of the steel sword exhausting his already weakened body, yet managed to escort the procession. I tried to lift up that massive sword, I could hardly brandish it. Later I asked him if he recovered from the arduous protocol, and with a twinkle in his eyes, he whispered, "I hope they'll do the same when it's my time." Yes, Papa they did. You got full honors and I am so proud to be your daughter! *Happy Father's Day!*

# The Most Holy Trinity Stewardship in Action

**BUEN CAMINO—GOOD WAY!** I attend Saturday, 5:00PM Mass. As you enter into our church, I sit on the left side—end of the fifth row closest to the Multi-Purpose Room. Since 1994, I have been a parishioner at St. Jude Parish. For the past 22 years, I go on PILGRIMAGES! Here are some of my experiences/adventures, so come and let's take a journey in finding *Time*, *Talent*, and *Treasure*.

This all started in 2003 when I worked in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Germany. My first pilgrimage was an audience visit in Rome where I saw our Holy Father, Pope John Paul II, now St. John Paul II. I cried when I saw him because I experienced seeing a holy man although he seemed fragile at the time. As I continued my pilgrimage in Rome, I visited the Basilicas —St. Peter's, St. John Lateran's, St. Paul's Outside the Walls, St. Mary Major, St. Cecilia, etc.

In April 2005, Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger became our new Holy Father—Pope Benedict XVI. I went on a pilgrimage to Marktl, Germany, to see where Pope Benedict was born, the church where he was baptized, school he attended, etc. In 2006, my pilgrimage to Regensburg, Germany, to see Pope Benedict XVI and attend Mass was simply special.

Although I was far away from St. Jude Church, I continually sent my donations to our parish. At that time, I believed I was given an opportunity to be away, but never forgotten my *Time, Talent, and Treasure* as being a good steward.

In 2006, I did a pilgrimage to Lourdes, France. The theme for that year was "Lumen Christi," which means the "Light of Christ." After my pilgrimage, I thought to myself, I would love to come here and be a volunteer one day.

Then in 2007, I had an amazing opportunity to go on my longest historical pilgrimage to walk *The Camino—The Way* from *Saint-*Jean-Pied-de-Port, France to Santiago de Compostela, Spain, approximately 800 kilometers or 500 miles. I walked step-by-step on the French Road to Spain. On the journey, I crossed over the Pyrenees, medieval bridges, hills, valleys, and villages. Every day was a new beginning—meeting new people along the way, having a meal with folks, and attending Mass throughout the journey. I did *The Camino* a second time in 2019 from Porto, Portugal.

After I returned home to Hawaii in 2008, I volunteered for Prison Ministry. Since 2009, I have served in Prison Ministry—serving in Catholic Communion Service and teach classes as well. This ministry has a special place in my heart, so I continue to serve.

In 2011, I discovered I could be a volunteer to serve at Lourdes Sanctuary, Lourdes, France. I serve as a Hospitalier (hospitality) of *Hospitalite Notre Dame de Lourdes in the Piscines* (baths) for pilgrims.

After my service at Lourdes in 2013, I went back to Rome to see our new Holy Father, Pope Francis in an audience visit. I am grateful and privileged to have now seen three Holy Fathers!

My other pilgrimages over the years included finding saints such as St. Bernadette of Lourdes, St. Teresa of Avila,


St. John of the Cross, St. Augustine, St. Catherine of Seina, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Clare of Assisi, St. Hildegard of Bingen, etc. My research in finding these holy saints has been my passion—where are their shrines, where they were born, and how they have been good and faithful stewards.

In 2023, my pilgrimage to the Holy Land was filled with awe and beauty. I found myself spending time and walking the footsteps as many others have done before. From Galilee—Jordan River—Capernaum—Nazareth—Jerusalem—Ein Karem—Bethlehem, and more is simply beautiful. I was amazed with its history, tradition, people, and food. I found my treasure in the Holy Land. I am praying to return there one day.

**Jubilee 2025**—In August, I will be going on my pilgrimage to serve at Lourdes. After my service, I will be going to Rome. I will once again, go through the Holy Doors—St. Peter's, St. John Lateran's, St. Paul's Outside the Walls, St. Mary Major. I hope and pray I will be able to serve as a volunteer participant in this Jubilee!

Throughout the years, I continue to find myself wanting to give more than to receive. I believe this is being a good steward—*Time, Talent, and Treasure*. I can look back now and say when I started my pilgrimage to Europe in 2003, and I return there every year to fill my well and come back home and share it with others.

# My Father's Last Father's Day—by John Zmirak

Last July, my father went away, leaving my life with a dad-shaped hole that nothing will ever fill. Only the preceding Christmas, the stomach cancer he'd been battling for a year had seemed to be in remission after surgery and chemotherapy, and for some months he was eating again—tiny portions because the surgery had left him with only a tiny, fist-sized stomach. He'd slimmed down from the big, burly, Santa Claus-sized dad I'd always known, and for the first time I could remember we both wore the same pants size.

The treatment won him nine months of health, time for dancing again at the senior center with the woman he'd married after Mom died in 1996, for a few hundred more tiny meals, and for starting household projects which he would not live to finish. By Easter 2005 he had lost all appetite and couldn't join the rest of us for supper. We convinced ourselves that this was just the after-effect of surgery and tried to find him food that he could keep down, but all through the spring we watched him fade away. By summer it was clear to everyone but him. He spent his last Father's Day at the old Astoria General Hospital in Queens, the same hospital where I was born.

They say that a father's example is decisive in most men's lives—and this is nowhere more true than in the spiritual life. A devout mother can usually pass along her faith to daughters intact, whether or not her husband is a believer. But for some deep psychic reason, most boys need to see their mothers' faith affirmed and practiced by their fathers, or they will lose it. I've seen this phenomenon at work in my own family. My sisters married non-believers and their own daughters still go to church but not their sons, who mimic their fathers' wry skepticism and chuckle as "girls" trot off to Mass.

I was blessed with a father who set a different example. Whenever he would wake me up with the sun on a weekend moming, I knew it was for one of two reasons: to go fishing or to the Holy Name Society Mass on the second Sunday of every month. This was an all-male affair for which the grocers, barbers, and other men in our working-class neighborhood dressed up in suits to honor the Mystery that drove them to their knees. We'd usually end the Mass by belting out this hymn: "Faith of our fathers, holy faith. We will be true to thee till death."

Then we'd troop down to the church basement to eat cheese Danishes, and drink coffee with milk but no sugar (I still think of it as "Holy Name Society coffee"), and organize our good works for the parish. My favorite task was the Christmas crèche. Together we'd hammer and saw and strew pine boughs, putting together the crib that would hold the Holy Family through the Advent and Christmas seasons. Of course, the baby Jesus was never placed in the crèche until Christmas Eve—and my father explained to me why: "It teaches us how to wait."

My father grew up during the Great Depression, the son of Croatian immigrants. My grandfather came from a family of fishermen and had earned his U.S. citizenship by joining the Merchant Marines during WW I.

My grandmother emigrated to America as a child and grew up on a houseboat on the Hudson River. She came down with Parkinson's disease when my father was 10. As she grew weaker, Dad would walk her slowly down the street to the movies or push her wheelchair through Hell's Kitchen, where he grew up. Eventually, he had to bathe her—and his little brother too. This must have been where he learned (too young) how to nurture the weak.

When Dad returned from World War II (where he'd served under General Patton in occupied Germany), he learned that Uncle Sam was offering him a free college education under the G.I. Bill. He'd dreamt of becoming a commercial artist—for which he had the talent—and college could give him the training. But my grandfather urged him to take a "safe" job, the kind that hadn't gone away during the Depression, and my mother was waiting to marry him. So Dad got a job at the Post Office. There he worked for 37 years, hauling mail on his back (no carts back then) through "rain and snow and gloom of night." He was gone before I woke up in the moming and returned each day to Queens to fall asleep while watching the "4:30 Movie" in the afternoon.

By happy chance, his route included Carnegie Hall—where he took me on a tour. It was my first trip into Manhattan, and I still feel a twinge when I enter the neighborhood where dad was once a daily fixture. They used to call him "the happy mailman" (not that he lacked a temper, of course). When I showed an interest in classical music, he asked the managers at Carnegie for tickets. I was 12 when he took me to hear Martina Arroyo. When he started to snore during her evening concert, I got annoyed. I'd forgotten that he'd gotten up for work at 5:00 that moming. He didn't remind me.

He and my mother found me a little puzzling—I was more bookish and talkative than most other kids in the neighborhood. "We didn't know what to do with you," he confessed to me not long before his final illness. But even though Dad didn't quite get why I preferred reading to fixing cars or playing baseball, he started bringing home books for me. I devoured each one, and I started scribbling stories myself, which he'd always patiently read—though sometimes he'd scold me for using "unnecessary big words." Decades later, when my first book came out, dedicated to him, he read that, too. Wilhelm Röpke: Swiss Localist, Global Economist was probably the first book on social philosophy he'd ever opened. "I loved it," he said in his potent Archie Bunker-style accent. "But I'm not sure I understood it."

And I guess that's how I feel about Dad. Looking back on the choices he made—on the opportunities he missed, the backbreaking work of he hauling mail day in and day out—I can't help but think that he lived in a different world from me. His talents went undeveloped, and his rough edges never got smoothed. But Dad was always *there*. You could always trust him. Every day, healthy or sick, he went to work. Every Sunday he was kneeling at Mass as an example for me. I always felt safe knowing that Dad was in the neighborhood (I moved next door, and I still live on my old block), long after he was too sick to lift a finger for me and I was too old to need it. His presence, his uncomplicated solidness, helped me imagine Our Loving Father who is behind the veil of creation, and it helps me even today.... though Dad slipped behind that veil years ago.
