

# corpus christi Stewardship in Action

Gregg grew up in Columbus, Ohio, graduating from Whetstone Highschool in 1965. Following high school, Gregg attended Ohio State University for one academic year, taking general courses (math, science, English, etc). He also joined the OSU Navy ROTC unit where he studied naval history. While attending OSU, Gregg became interested in the Navy from his exposure at the ROTC unit. That unit had students from all over the central United States.

That freshman year at OSU, the university president had the opportunity to award two appointments to the U.S. Naval Academy. The president sponsored a test of all interested students and Gregg participated. Gregg had been living with his grandmother to keep her company as his grandfather had passed away the year before. Returning to his grandmother's home following classes one rainy afternoon, he walked through the front door and was removing his raincoat when he noticed his mother and grandmother both standing in the front hallway, looking at him, but not speaking. Drippingwet, Greggremoved his coat and asked "What?" His mother held out a letter and told him "You're accepted at the U.S. Naval Academy." And as they say, "The rest is history…"

Gregg reported to "Canoe U" that same summer on July  $26^{th}$ , 1965. He graduated on June  $3^{rd}$ , 1970...a long, long time ago.

Throughout his varied Navy assignments, there were two which stand out in his memory. First, he was the Chief of Staff for Fleet Maintenance, U.S. Pacific Fleet from 1992 – 1995. In that capacity, Gregg was the direct representative of the supervising Flag Officer, who directed all Maintenance operations and execution of the entire public and private shipyard maintenance budget for all U.S. Navy Pacific Fleet ships. Most importantly during this assignment at Pacific Fleet, Gregg met *Claire*, his future wife. He and Claire were married during his next tour of duty.

Perhaps the assignment of which he was proudest was as the Commanding Officer, Ship Repair Facility (SRF) Guam. At the time Gregg commanded SRF Guam, it was a 660-man ship repair facility, which worked projects in ship propulsion and auxiliary equipment onboard U.S. Navy, Coast Guard, Military Sealift Command and commercial ships.

Gregg had to depart Oahu in July 1995 to travel to Guam for assumption of the SRF Guam command. Claire was certain when Gregg departed, she would not see him again. It was a tearful departure, but Gregg knew he had to get things organized at SRF Guam before he could spend more time with Claire. Once he held the reins over the 600+ man facility, Gregg did return to Oahu a couple months later with the sole purpose of asking Claire to many him. Taking her to Nick's Fishmarket Gregg deftly dropped the engagement ring into Claire's wine glass... "What's this?" she exclaimed. Thrown off-guard, Gregg responded "Willyou marry me?" Seizing the moment, Claire said "Why should !? So you can leave me again?" In desperation, Gregg asked again "Claire, come on... Will you marry me?!" Thankfully, she said "YES" and again... "the rest is history."

Gregg has been attending St Jude Catholic Church since 1997. During his final assignments as C.O. SRF Guam and as the Chief Engineer at the Board of Inspection and Survey, he attended St Jude whenever he was home on Oahu. Finally, in February 2000, Gregg finished his Navy career of thirty years and returned home for good.

Claire told Gregg he could go wherever his subsequent occupation may send him; travel for whatever his job may require...however, she was going to live in Hawaii. Well, that sort of settled where Gregg would locate.

On Oahu, Gregg worked for Young Brothers, QED Systems and MARISCO Shipyard for nearly 20 more years before finally retiring in May 2023. Now he and his wife Claire reside in Makakilo. Their three daughters have since all grown and "flew the coup". One daughter lives in Tacoma, WA; one lives in Las Vegas, NV; and one is an Army sergeant stationed at Fort Riley, KS. (Unfortunately, none of them joined the Navy.)

Raising their family on Oahu, Gregg and Claire both highly value their Catholic faith. Prayer, scripture and the Holy Spirit have been active participants in their lives. When Gregg suffered a stroke in 2004, Claire prayed earnestly for his recovery. With God's help, Gregg did indeed recover and lives today largely with-

out after-affects. Then again in 2017, Gregg underwent lung surgery to remove melanoma growths in his right lung. Claire's earnest callings to the Lord were answered, as Gregg recovered completely. He is still under the care of an oncologist, but he remains "On Parole" with no detectable cancer. Most importantly, God has continued to watch over Claire and the girls. All remain healthytoday.

Gregg always yearned to be a more active member of his church. But the Navy life kept him moving too often. Once he completed his Navy obligation, Gregg joined the 9 AM church choir and is still a participating member. And Fr. Khanh appointed him to the St. Jude Pastoral Council in 2020.

Gregg applied for the Deaconate program in April 2012. He attended and studied with the other deacon candidates for two years. For him, it was a wonderful opportunity to learn more about Catholicism. The deaconate course work was taught by very knowledgeable people, who brought the history of the Catholic Church to life. Interesting, informative and entertaining, the course work was a wonderful opportunity to grow in the faith. Unfortunately, Gregg was chosen in 2014 not to continue as a deaconate candidate. To say he was disappointed is a great understatement; however, Gregg knew he had developed in his faith during his discernment, and that the Lord had much more in store for him.

One area wherein Gregg found a mission occurred in May 2019. That month St. Jude sponsored a Blood Drive and he was the designated coordinator. Acknowledging the urgent value of donated blood, Gregg worked with the Hawaii Blood Bank Coordinator and arranged for the drive to occur at St. Jude. May 18, 2019 until July 26, 2025, St. Jude will have sponsored Blood Drives every year for the past seven years.

Gregg & Claire just celebrated their 30<sup>th</sup> Wedding Anniversary. Deacon Raul Perez presided over a ceremony conducted at their home on May 31<sup>st</sup> during which the couple renewed their wedding vows before about 60 guests. Also attending were two of their three daughters, seven of their ten granddaughters, two brothers and two sisters-in-law, etc. Gregg sang the "Hawaiian Wedding Song" to Claire as she walked to join him standing with Deacon Raul. The weather was wonderful, the groom kissed the bride, all the guests seemed to enjoythemselves and God blessed us once again with a beautiful day!
