¹ Format subject to change in the interest of communicating relevant financial information weekly, balancing clarity with simplicity; the Parish Finance Council reviews parish finances in more detail at a minimum of each fiscal quarter, and advises the pastor on all financial matters.

² Including Mass intentions, sacramental offerings, blessings, outreach & candles, etc.

³ Benchmarks include new categories of *Mortgage Capital Reserve* and *Moving Monthly Mortgage Allocation*; both goal amounts must be met in order for the design and construction of a new Church building and campus to be considered feasible at the future site of St. Jude Parish (at the *Leihano* property).

⁴ Annual budget divided by 52 weeks; weekly collection amounts can vary according to season and celebration (e.g. Christmas collection, Easter Collection, etc.).

⁵ Capital funds reserved for design/construction of new Church building/campus; consider this akin to a mortgage deposit that is required in order to secure a loan for the remaining balance; these funds are not assessable (i.e. "taxable") by the Diocese of Honolulu; the goal amount is ½ the estimated construction amount, subject to change and based on latest estimates.

⁶ Shared for informational purposes only, updated annually, and subject to change; the \$27K is the monthly mortgage amount that St. Jude can currently afford based on present financial situation and mortgage assumptions; the \$64K is the goal amount required to afford a \$10M loan, which is a rough estimate of the loan amount necessary in order to complete building a new Church building/campus at the *Leihano* property; \$27K will be allocated each month into the Mortgage Capital Reserve for Fiscal Year beginning on July 1, 2025 and ending on June 30, 2026; this amount may increase or decrease in the next fiscal year.

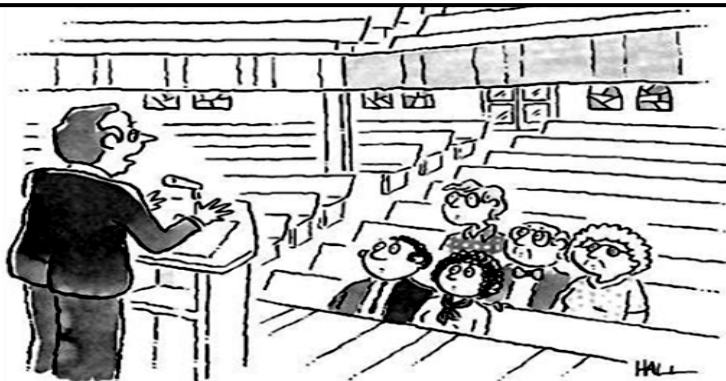

The practice of tithing dated as far back as biblical times with laws about giving a tenth of one's harvest to the poor. Presently, people interpret tithing to mean everything from a strict 10% weekly religious donation to any gift of money or volunteer time. So you ask, is tithing an old-fashioned method of requiring charity or is it a spiritual practice? It is difficult to consider giving to the church during tough times, when faced with a nagging sickness, an old car in need of new tires, or rent money squandered at the pub. People assume that they are the owners of their money. They toil for their money, therefore, it belongs to them. Yet they forget that the ability to make money comes from God, He provides the opportunities and strength to allow us to generate that money. It is foolish to regard anything in life, especially finances, as our own without understanding God's omnipotence. We are the stewards of all the resources that God entrusts to us, including money that we earn in our lifetime. Our directive is to love our neighbor, not to claim everything as our own, but to *share* what we have with those who are in far worse circumstances than we may be. As Christians, recognize that there are others who are lacking basic needs more dire than ours. Our church needs this money to function too. It is a very real way to do God's work in the lives of others, and one of the best ways to give back to a place where you worship and build community. Beware that the love of money does not consume you so that it rules your life and becomes your idol. Putting your trust in money is unwise for it can disappear just as quickly. Put your hope in God who gives us everything for our enjoyment, whose love is endless and gives us only what we need. Invest in making a difference in God's kingdom. Helping others will reap eternal rewards, a splendor beyond richness not of this world, but His.

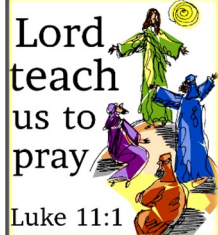

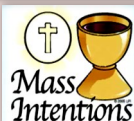
