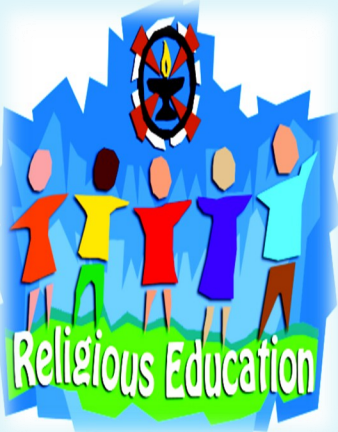

⁴ **Proposed Updated Budget divided by 52 weeks**; weekly collection amounts can vary according to season and celebration (e.g. Christmas collection, Easter Collection, etc.).

⁵ Capital funds reserved for design/construction of new Church building/campus; consider this akin to a mortgage deposit that is required in order to secure a loan for the remaining balance; these funds are not assessable (i.e. “taxable”) by the Diocese of Honolulu; the goal amount is ½ the estimated construction amount, subject to change and based on latest estimates. **Adjusted for schematic design payment.**

⁶ Shared for informational purposes only, updated annually, and subject to change; the \$27K is the monthly mortgage amount that St. Jude can currently afford based on present financial situation and mortgage assumptions; the \$64K is the goal amount required to afford a \$10M loan, which is a rough estimate of the loan amount necessary in order to complete building a new Church building/campus at the *Leihano* property; \$27K will be allocated each month into the Mortgage Capital Reserve for Fiscal Year beginning on July 1, 2025 and ending on June 30, 2026; this amount may increase or decrease in the next fiscal year.

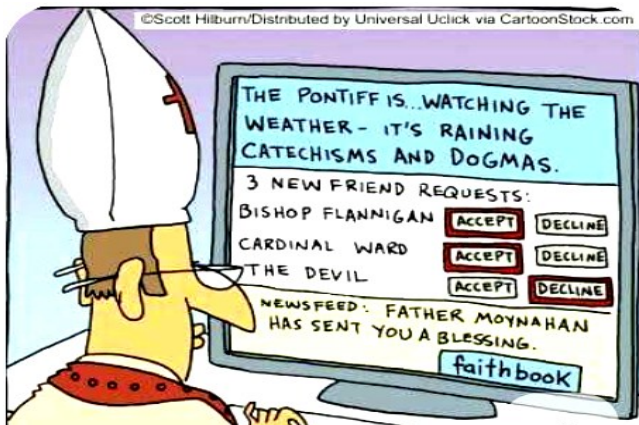

Often we hear phrases like “*Stay cool as a cucumber.*” “*Keep it together.*” Bottle up your emotions. Hah! Many do not see anything wrong with suppressing their emotions or even teaching their children to do the same. For them, showing emotions in public is disruptive, impolite, or a sign of weakness. Restraining your emotions is a form of control, an indication of strength. Yet this could prove disastrous. Subduing your emotions for considerable time may cause you to explode unexpectedly and the receiving end might prove fatal. Your social relationship suffers because your inhibited feelings may affect your mental and emotional health leading to isolation and depression. If you never allow yourself to express your anger, it becomes a struggle to even speak up and then you become a doormat. Reported studies show that chronic stress can cause ulcers, damage to your digestive tract, increasing risk of heart attack, cancer, even diabetes! Chronic stress leads to insomnia, then sleep deprivation then the dreaded weight gain, to brain inflammation which compounds the likelihood of dementia and Alzheimers. Despite rising evidence that emotional repression is catastrophic to human relationships, people continue to internalize their sentiments. If you still believe letting out your emotions as improper, think of whether the consequences of continued suppression is really worth it. Wouldn’t you rather witness someone express compassion when they tear up at a movie than thrust their car into a ditch because they lost sleep? “*Cast all your anxieties on Him, because He cares for you.*” 1 Peter 5:7

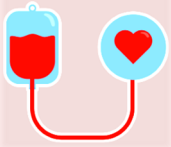

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,


In 2002, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops developed the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. This document guides our efforts to promote healing and reconciliation with victims/survivors of sexual abuse of minors by clergy, religious or lay employees/volunteers. It outlines an effective response to allegations of sexual abuse, calls for more effective screening of those entering service in the Church, and provides for education for clergy and others who have contact with minors or who are in a position of trust in the Church. Safe Environment programs have been implemented in parishes and schools throughout the country as a response to the Charter.

The Diocese of Honolulu is committed to continuing implementation of the Charter and do all we humanly can to prevent such a tragedy from happening again.

- Our Victim Assistance Program reaches out to those who may have been sexually abused as minors.
- Our Safe Environment training and educational programs continue to be conducted for children, youth and all who are in a position of trust over time. Training is required for all clergy, religious and lay staff, as well as volunteers who may have regular contact with youth in any aspect of Church life. Records are maintained regarding who has been trained, renewal training is required periodically. A listing of the approved safe environment curricula, all of which are in good moral standing with the Catholic Church, is available on the Diocese website.
- The Code of Pastoral Conduct is based on the *Model Code of Pastoral Conduct* developed by the VIRTUS “best practices” program designed for religious organizations; it was first promulgated on January 8, 2004.
- The Standards for Technology usage, are adapted from the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry’s *Recommended Technology Standards for Pastoral Work with Young People*, developed in 2010 in consultation with the USCCB Secretariat for Child and Youth Protection and the Secretariat for Laity, Marriage, Family Life, and Youth; and *Catholic Mutual Group’s Network Security Policy and Usage*, published in May 2011.
- All clergy, religious and lay staff, and all volunteers who have regular contact with youth in any aspect of Church life are required to submit to criminal background checks, as permitted by law. Pastors, principals and administrators are responsible for ensuring that these checks are carried out and for maintaining records of compliance with this directive.

We affirm our commitment to work diligently to prevent the sexual abuse of minors. We pray forgiveness from those persons who were abused as minors by clergy, religious or Church employees and we pray that the healing power of Christ may touch them. We thank God for our children and youth and commit ourselves to care for them as gifts of God’s love.

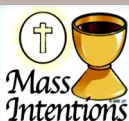
