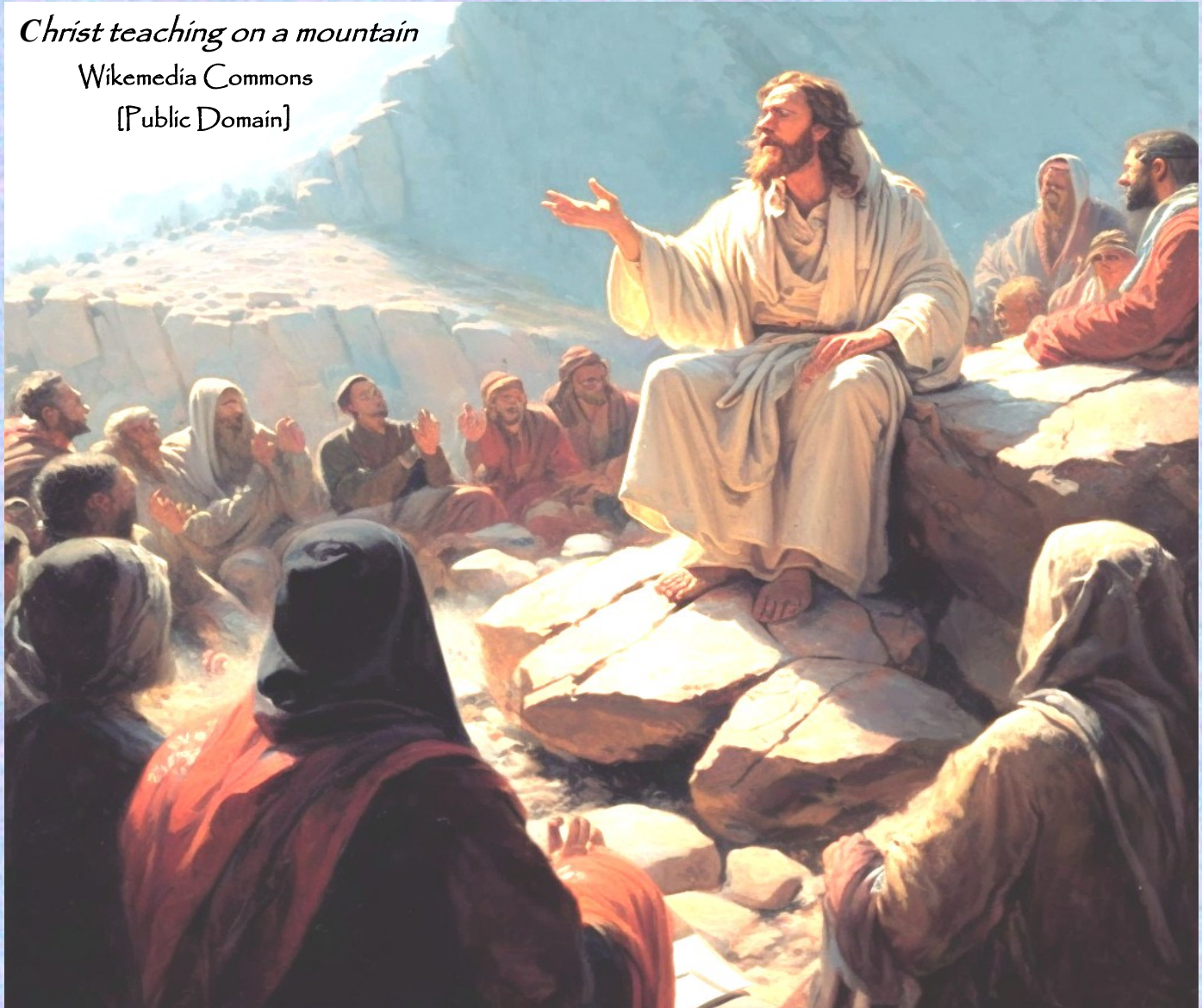

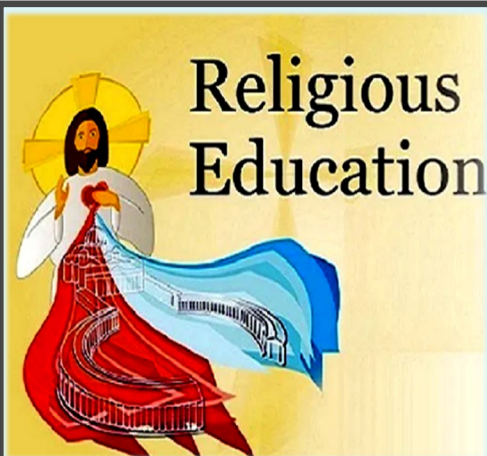

<sup>6</sup> Shared for informational purposes only, updated annually, and subject to change; the \$27K is the monthly mortgage amount that St. Jude can currently afford based on present financial situation and mortgage assumptions; the \$64K is the goal amount required to afford a \$10M loan, which is a rough estimate of the loan amount necessary in order to complete building a new Church building/campus at the *Leihano* property; \$27K will be allocated each month into the Mortgage Capital Reserve for Fiscal Year beginning on July 1, 2025 and ending on June 30, 2026; this amount may increase or decrease in the next fiscal year.

## LIFE JOURNEY OF MEL & PAULA ABRAZADO

While teaching at St. Joseph's School (1969-1970), The Sisters of St. Joseph introduced my roommates and me to Mel. Mel used to help the sisters with small tasks around the school. Whenever a new group of lay apostle teachers arrived at St. Joseph School, they would ask Mel to take them around and introduce them to the island and his friends. They told us how much Mel helped them, but they were always unsuccessful getting him to attend Sunday Mass. Well, after a few months, Mel started dating Paula, and on Sundays if Mel was in town, she would ask him to drop her off at Church for Sunday Mass. He would do this and then pick her up....after awhile he finally figured out that he might as well stay and attend the Mass. So you can see that evangelization can be through actions and not necessarily words. Paula turned out to be a good role model.

In August of 1971, Mel & Paula married at her college chapel in Massachusetts. They lived in Kaneohe and attended St. Ann's Church for 3 years. During that time they continued to attend Mass on Sundays, Mel continued his flying, and Paula worked for the Dept. of Personal Services teaching Defensive Driving Classes to state employees. In 1974, they bought a town home in Mililani and during that time, Paula changed jobs and began teaching at St. John the Baptist Catholic School, where she taught for 7 years. While living in Mililani, they attended weekly Mass at St John's Church, where Mel finally received the sacrament of Confirmation. ***That was a very significant moment in his Catholic journey.***

In 1979 they bought a home in Makakilo, and they began attending Mass at St. Jude's Parish. Their involvement with the parish was limited to attending weekly Mass and making weekly monetary donations. Stewardship also involves sharing of time and talents, and these were more difficult to commit to. Although they contemplated joining the lector or Eucharistic ministries many times, they always found excuses, even though speaking and interacting with people were parts of their everyday jobs. Estrella Estillore constantly asked Mel to become a lector, and Mel always said "no" because he did not have a set schedule with his type of work. Then one day, he said he would lector at the Sunday Mass, and later discovered he was flying out and requested a sub!! Of course, the sub was Paula! That's how they both began lectoring. They both found lectoring very rewarding. There was a personal satisfaction in knowing that they were serving the Lord in a ministry that allowed them to proclaim His word just as He had entrusted his apostles to do...so as lectors they too became a very important instrument in achieving the Lord's goal. Now they were able to share their speaking talents.

In 1982 their son, *Michael*, was born. Paula decided to step away from full-time teaching for a couple of years and be more involved in motherhood. During that time, she worked a couple of hours a week teaching the competency-based high school certified program to adults at Campbell high school. Once Michael was old enough for pre-school, she returned to full-time teaching. She taught at St. Elizabeth School in Aiea for 31 years. After 39 years teaching in the Hawaii Catholic Schools, Paula retired in 2017.

In 1988 former pastor, Rev. Jim Berry was recruiting Eucharistic ministers, and Mel & Paula felt comfortable serving the Lord in this capacity. They found this a very humbling experience. The Holy Eucharist which is the source and summit of our Christian lives had now become an action of Thanksgiving to God that was very meaningful. Being lay Eucharistic ministers made them feel very blessed to be so close to the Lord each time they received His Body and Blood, and each time they shared His love with all the faithful parishioners.

In 1992, Linda Magno was the director of liturgy. Prior to Linda moving from the parish, she approached Paula and asked if she would be the Mass coordinator for one of the Sunday Masses. Paula said yes and 33 years later, she is still the Mass coordinator for the 9:00 Mass, but now has Mel as her right hand man! Little by little, they both began to increase their sharing of time and talents.

During the early 2000's, Paula served on the Pastoral Council for several years. She was able to utilize her teaching skills to contribute ideas as a member of the council. In 2006, Mel furthered his involvement in the church by joining the Knights of Columbus. Helping with the annual fish fry, assisting in pancake breakfasts, etc. throughout the year are activities that are very rewarding to him. He always enjoys giving back to the church and serving the Parish community. Besides participating in these ministries, Mel truly enjoys golfing and loves joining fellow parishioners and priests with the St. Jude Golf Club on Tuesdays.

Following Paula's retirement from teaching in 2017, she was asked by Fr. Khanh to become the altar server coordinator. Along with the help of Mel, Lana Vargas, and Deacon Raul, she continued to help with the training in this ministry until the fall of 2024.

As you can see, Mel and Paula evolved from minimal involvement in the church to taking on more responsibilities. They encouraged others to become apostles and serve the Lord by considering to join a ministry or to make a difference in this world by sharing their Catholic faith. Just aspiring to inspire others through actions and words is doing God's work. They often think of the 3<sup>rd</sup> verse from the hymn, Service: *"if we give of ourselves both time and again, the happiness of Christ will live within."* Mel & Paula thank all of the St. Jude's parishioners, who every Sunday greet them with a welcoming smile and gather to celebrate the Holy Eucharist. They both feel blessed to have grown together in their personal and Catholic lives for the past 54 years.

## BRIEF BACKGROUND ON MEL & PAULA ABRAZADO

**Paula** was raised in a Polish Catholic family on the East coast in Chicopee, Massachusetts. During her early years, her involvement in the church was minimal. Although her older sisters attended the local Catholic school, she was afraid of the nuns so her parents chose

to enroll her into a public school. She then attended the CCD program on weekends, and continued only until she was in 5<sup>th</sup> grade at which time she received the sacrament of Confirmation. After being confirmed, her only involvement was attending weekly Sunday Mass. Attending Mass and receiving the Holy Eucharist were always an important part of her life. After graduating from high school in 1965, she surprised everyone by choosing to enroll in the only Catholic Liberal Arts College in Western Massachusetts, The Elms College. She graduated with a degree in Sociology and Elementary Education in 1969. Following graduation, she entered a lay apostolate program, which recruited recent graduates to teach in Catholic schools in the United States. She was assigned to St. Joseph School in Waipahu, **which proved to be a turning point in her life.**

**Mel** was raised in a Filipino Catholic family and spent his early years living in Kalihi Valley with his parents and 6 siblings. Although he was baptized a Catholic, attending Sunday Mass was not a part of his regular routine. He graduated from Farrington High School in 1962. After graduating, he joined the Air force and remained in the military for 4 years. In 1968, he was hired by United Airlines as a Flight Attendant, and continued his flying career for 35 years. After retiring from United in 2003, he became co-owners with his brother of the Mililani Golf Course Restaurant. He remained in the restaurant business until 2016 when he fully retired.
