- 1 Format subject to change in the interest of communicating relevant financial information weekly, balancing clarity with simplicity; the Parish Finance Council reviews parish finances in more detail at a minimum of each fiscal quarter, and advises the pastor on all financial matters.
- 2 Including Mass intentions, sacramental offerings, blessings, outreach & candles, etc.
- 3 Benchmarks include new categories of Mortgage Capital Reserve and Moving Monthly Mortgage Allocation; both goal amounts must be met in order for the design and construction of a new Church building and campus to be considered feasible at the future site of St. Jude Parish (at the Leihano property).
- 4 Proposed Updated Budget divided by 52 weeks; weekly collection amounts can vary according to season and celebration (e.g. Christmas collection, Easter Collection, etc.).
- 5 Capital funds reserved for design/construction of new Church building/campus; consider this akin to a mortgage deposit that is required in order to secure a loan for the remaining balance; these funds are not assessable (i.e. “taxable”) by the Diocese of Honolulu; the goal amount is ½ the estimated construction amount, subject to change and based on latest estimates. Adjusted for schematic design payment.
- 6 Shared for informational purposes only, updated annually, and subject to change; the \$27K is the monthly mortgage amount that St. Jude can currently afford based on present financial situation and mortgage assumptions; the \$64K is the goal amount required to afford a \$10M loan, which is a rough estimate of the loan amount necessary in order to complete building a new Church building/campus at the Leihano property; \$27K will be allocated each month into the Mortgage Capital Reserve for Fiscal Year beginning on July 1, 2025 and ending on June 30, 2026; this amount may increase or decrease in the next fiscal year.

The Facts about Mandated and Ethical Reporting

Introduction

Every person involved in the life of a child has the opportunity to make a significant difference in that child's life—regardless of their role or level of interaction. One of the most important tools safe adults have to combat child sexual abuse includes recognizing and reporting abuse. We must become more aware of the facts, best practices—and the law, to respond appropriately when abuse does happen.

When do we need to report abuse?

Report any disclosures about child sexual abuse, physical abuse, emotional abuse or neglect to your state's child protective services or local law enforcement as soon as possible. A disclosure of abuse occurs when a child or youth shares that they have experienced abuse. There is no gray area for disclosures—these must be reported.

In addition, report anything that gives you a belief or a suspicion that a child or youth has been abused in any way—this includes suspicions of abuse based on observed behavior or information that was communicated to you. A reasonable suspicion of abuse means that based on a scenario or situation, a thought or concern has entered your mind that the child could be in a current abusive situation, or may have experienced abuse in the past.

Mandated and Ethical Reporters

Anyone can report suspected or known child abuse, anytime, day or night. Mandated Reporters are persons who are legally required to report suspected or disclosed cases of abuse or maltreatment to child protective service agencies or law enforcement. In some states, every adult is a mandated reporter, by law. In other states, you are more likely to be a mandated reporter based on your profession or interaction with children.

However, regardless of the law, everyone has an ethical and moral obligation to report known or suspected child abuse—this includes whether the adult is “on” or “off-duty,” which means that the mandated reporter is always required to report abuse. Additionally, even if the law in your state does not specifically des-

ignate you as a mandated reporter, it is possible that your organization might have a policy that obligates you to make reports of child abuse or maltreatment. For many who are involved in child-serving organizations, the organization's policy elevates them to be

mandated reporters from an ethical perspective.

Many states have laws that require reporting within a certain timeframe, typically from 24-48 hours. However, the best practice is just to report as soon as possible. After you communicate with child protective services, you may

also need to follow up with your supervisor or your organization's child protection office if it involves a child or employee/volunteer of the organization.

Report even if you aren't sure if abuse is actually happening, and even when you feel that you don't have all of the facts. Keep in mind that disclosures must always be taken seriously—a child doesn't need to have any of the common indicators of sexual abuse for you to believe them and take action. It's unlikely that we will ever be positive that abuse is occurring, and we will rarely have all the facts. We need to report anyway.

When in doubt of whether or not you should make a report, always err on the side of protecting the child, and make the report. Your action of reporting could be the determining factor as to whether an investigation will occur, even if others have already reported. And, you never know if your report will be what ultimately saves that child's life, or gets them the help they need.

Protecting St. Jude's Keiki

St. Jude Catholic Church maintains a database, along with the Diocese of Honolulu, of all volunteers working with children and youth in our parish. Volunteers must complete an online training program titled Protecting God's Children® by the Diocese's Safe Environment service Virtus Online.
