⁴ **Proposed Updated Budget divided by 52 weeks**; weekly collection amounts can vary according to season and celebration (e.g. Christmas collection, Easter Collection, etc.).

⁵ Capital funds reserved for design/construction of new Church building/campus; consider this akin to a mortgage deposit that is required in order to secure a loan for the remaining balance; these funds are not assessable (i.e. “taxable”) by the Diocese of Honolulu; the goal amount is ½ the estimated construction amount, subject to change and based on latest estimates. **Adjusted for schematic design payment.**

⁶ Shared for informational purposes only, updated annually, and subject to change; the \$27K is the monthly mortgage amount that St. Jude can currently afford based on present financial situation and mortgage assumptions; the \$64K is the goal amount required to afford a \$10M loan, which is a rough estimate of the loan amount necessary in order to complete building a new Church building/campus at the *Leihano* property; \$27K will be allocated each month into the Mortgage Capital Reserve for Fiscal Year beginning on July 1, 2025 and ending on June 30, 2026; this amount may increase or decrease in the next fiscal year.

Discover Fr. Jack Legal: Our Choir Crooner and more.....

National Vocations Awareness Week Celebrating the Gift of Priesthood: The Story of Fr. Jack Legal

This week, as we celebrate National Vocations Awareness Week, our parish community at St. Jude's Church joyfully honors the vocation and remarkable journey of **Fr. Jack Legal**, a priest whose life reflects deep faith, resilience, and service across continents.

Fr. Jack was born in **Cataingan, Masbate** in the Visayas region of the Philippines. His call to the priesthood took root early. He pursued his high school formation at **Our Lady of Peñafrancia Minor Seminary**, then continued to **Holy Rosary Major Seminary** in Naga City, where he earned a **Bachelor of Arts degree in Philosophy**. Committed to serving God's people, he traveled to the United States in **1973** to complete his theological studies at **St. John's Seminary in Camarillo, California**, receiving a **Master of Divinity** degree.

On **June 25, 1977**, Fr. Jack was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Masbate at Nativity Church in El Monte, California, by Bishop Manuel Moreno. His earliest assignments led him to serve as associate pastor in several vibrant parishes in California: **Holy Trinity Church in Los Angeles, St. Monica Church in Santa Monica, and St. Louise de Marillac in Covina.**

With a missionary heart, Fr. Jack returned in **1983** to his home diocese in the Philippines, where he became pastor of **St. Bernard Church in Mandaon, Masbate**. There, he faced significant challenges—no electricity, no running water, and a rectory overrun by termites. Undeterred, he had the rectory demolished and rebuilt into a simple bungalow. While the parish construction was underway, he even transformed a chicken coop into his temporary living quarters—joyfully embracing sacrifice for the sake of the community he served.

In **1986**, another call to service emerged as Fr. Jack returned to the United States to become a **Catholic chaplain in the U.S. Army**. His ministry followed soldiers through training

fields in Egypt, South Korea, Pohakuloa, and even California's Death Valley, providing spiritual support wherever duty called.

After completing his military chaplaincy, Fr. Jack settled in **Hawaii**, where his life took an unexpected yet grace-filled path. He pursued law school, earning a **Juris Doctor** degree, and though he is a non-practicing lawyer, he remains an associate member of the **American Bar Association**. His entrepreneurial spirit flourished as he founded his own real estate company, **Legal Realty**. He went on to serve as **President of the Honolulu Board of Realtors** and later the **Hawaii Association of Realtors**, being named **Realtor of the Year** in both roles. The City and County of Honolulu honored him by proclaiming **December 4** as "**Jack Legal Day**."

Despite his many accomplishments, Fr. Jack's heart has remained rooted in faith and community. Here at St. Jude's, he shared his talents not only in ministry but also in music—joyfully singing with the **9 AM Choir**. In his free time, he enjoys golf, reading, and writing. His forthcoming book, "**Failure – A Pathway to Success**," will be published by Christian Faith Publishing and offers reflections shaped by a lifetime of perseverance and grace.

As we highlight vocations this week, Fr. Jack's story reminds us that the priesthood is not only lived at the altar, but wherever God leads His priests to bring hope, service, and Christ's love into the world.
