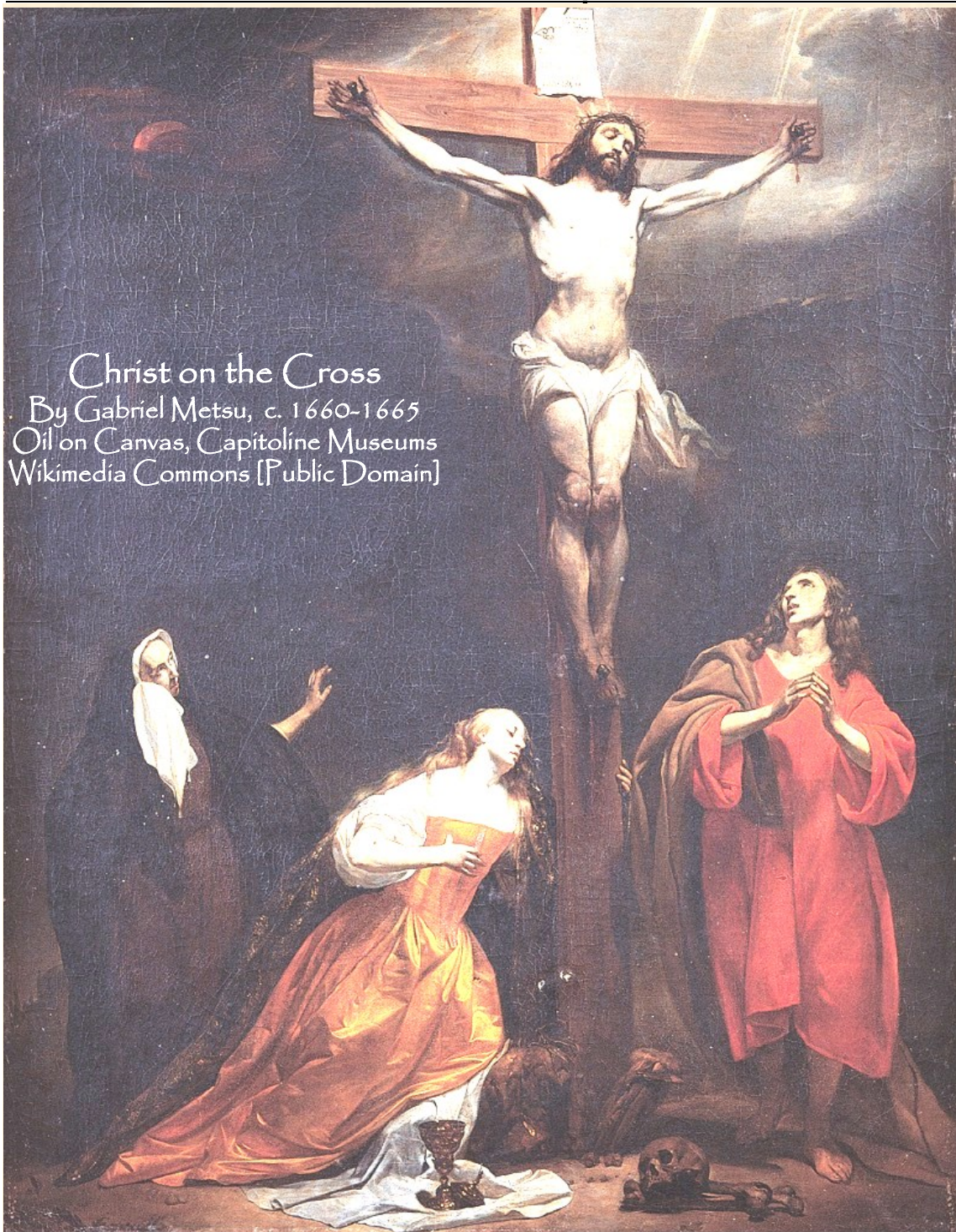

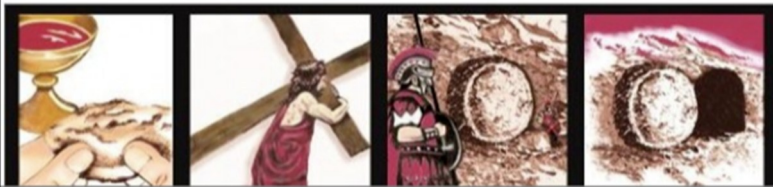

⁵ Capital funds reserved for design/construction of new Church building/campus; consider this akin to a mortgage deposit that is required in order to secure a loan for the remaining balance; these funds are not assessable (i.e. “taxable”) by the Diocese of Honolulu; the goal amount is ½ the estimated construction amount, subject to change and based on latest estimates. **Adjusted for schematic design payment.**

⁶ Shared for informational purposes only, updated annually, and subject to change; the \$27K is the monthly mortgage amount that St. Jude can currently afford based on present financial situation and mortgage assumptions; the \$64K is the goal amount required to afford a \$10M loan, which is a rough estimate of the loan amount necessary in order to complete building a new Church building/campus at the *Leihano* property; \$27K will be allocated each month into the Mortgage Capital Reserve for Fiscal Year beginning on July 1, 2025 and ending on June 30, 2026; this amount may increase or decrease in the next fiscal year.

Jesus said, “If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me.” Jesus made disciples and the disciples made disciples and their disciples made disciples. In this age where church no longer seems relevant or helpful, many are leaving and losing site of Jesus’ call. What’s more, the ones who make it to Sunday service may lack the commitment to evangelism. A disciple is a follower, one who assists in spreading the doctrines of another. A Christian disciple accepts and assists in the spreading of the Good News of Jesus Christ. What makes them unique is that they grow in Jesus Christ AND are empowered by the Holy Spirit residing in their hearts, to overcome the demands and ordeals of this present life to become Christ-like. We inherit the Holy Spirit’s power! Jesus spent 3 years initiating 12 men 24/7 interacting with them not through PowerPoint or syllabus, but teaching them by His example using His own creation (birds, lilies). His method of creating disciples was focused on relationships and action, less on information and knowledge. Treating each disciple as individuals, confronting Peter, loving John, and challenging Thomas. Whether there are 3 or 20 in a group, what matters is the quality of relationships built with one another AND the quality of relationship each person has with God. When broken people come together with nothing to impress or hide, it’s easier to have an honest relationship which becomes an effective discipleship. Discipleship naturally occurs from a group hanging out and growing together. Yet discipleship cannot be forced because it involves personal growth to become like Jesus. It focuses on reflecting Jesus in every area of our lives, instead of being self-centered. His life is a perfect example of how we relate to others. Loving and forgiving. “Whoever wants to be My disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow Me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for Me and for the Gospel will save it” (Mark 8:34-36).

Dear Padre Why should I believe Jesus founded the Catholic Church?

What a great question, especially during our Easter season, when the readings at Mass are about how the early Church discovers its mission and identity. Jesus intended to found a Church to carry on His mission.

Jesus chose twelve men to accompany him and learn from him. He passed on His mission to them: “Whoever listens to you listens to me. Whoever rejects you rejects me. And whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me” (Luke 10:16). Jesus called Simon Bar-Jonah “Peter,” meaning “rock.” Indicating His foundational role, Jesus said to Peter, “I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven” (Matthew 16:19).



Throughout the New Testament, we read how the apostles in their turn passed on their authority to other individuals by the laying on of hands (Acts 6:6; 13:3; 1 Timothy 4:14; 2 Timothy 1:6). Initially, the only two orders were bishops and deacons but soon priests were also ordained to share some of the authority of the bishop and to be his assistants.

The Church would exist and do Jesus' work until the end of time. The whole Church, “the “Body of Christ,” as Paul would call it (1 Corinthians 12:27), would be Christ acting in the world on His behalf. The Church and all its members are to be “the light of the world” and “the salt of the earth” (Matthew 5:13-16).
