Here’s a Reflection reprinted from “Give us This Day”

Genuine Simplicity by Jeremy Hall, OSB

An interior genuine simplicity, rooted in single heartedness, an all-embracing focus on the will of God His Father, overflowed into and characterized all Jesus did. He invited followers with no promises, healed and cured with no great showmanship, faced temptation directly with neither self-pity nor compromise, prayed simply and from His heart, spoke forthrightly to other people in authority, and talked simply and with great compassion to those who suffered or were in need.

If we disciples today were satisfied with what we need, if we lived more simply, would there not be far fewer people hungry and cold and homeless? If it is not material things or position and power we seek, might it not be something by which we especially seduced in our day: self? We hear it on every side—self-identity, self-realization, self-actualization, self-discovery, self-assertion, and self-fulfillment.

I wonder if Jesus’ answer to today’s convoluted preoccupation with self may not lie in that awesome challenge: “If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me” (Matthew 16:24). In recent years I have pondered more the saying of Christ in Matthew 10:39: “Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it.” I understand it this way: Those who seek only themselves, that is, the ego self, to naught for me *discover who they are*. It was by emptying Himself that the Lord came to the fullness of who He is for all eternity—the God-man, the deepest bond between the human and the divine. And it is by following the self-emptying Christ that we can come to that fullness of life for which we are destined..

**Couples Facing Infertility and NaPro Technology**By Dcn. Gary Streff, *Respect Life*

It is often heartbreaking when a married couple faces difficulty achieving a successful pregnancy. The desire for a child is natural. However, it is not always possible for married couples to conceive. In the United States, it is estimated that one out of six couples have difficulty getting pregnant. Infertility is defined as “*the inability for a woman to conceive after 12 months or more of regular unprotected intercourse.*” Many couples will seek medical advice from their primary care provider, the woman’s gynecologist and/or an endocrinologist (doctor who specializes in hormonal dysfunction).

There are two distinct types of fertility treatments; one is known as **ART, Artificial Reproductive Technology**. It refers to medical fertility treatments where both eggs and sperm are handled in a laboratory to help a person achieve pregnancy. **In Vitro Fertilization (IVF)** is the most common method of Artificial Reproductive Technology. Since it separates the unitive (love-giving) and procreative (life-giving) aspects of marriage, or replaces natural marital intercourse, it is not approved by Church teachings.

The second type of fertility treatment is called **Fertility Awareness Based Methods**. Many are familiar with it being called “**Natural Family Planning**”. Since the 1960’s the Catholic Church has always endorsed Natural Family Planning. Today this basic “rhythm” method, tracking a woman’s fertile window has evolved into a highly scientifically precise science known as Fertility Awareness-Based Methods. It involves a deeper understanding of the reproductive biology of both the men and women.

**NaPro Technology** (Natural Procreative Technology) is a type of Fertility Awareness Based Methods. It is derived from the Creighton Model Fertility Care System using biomarkers and the woman’s natural cycle to determine her fertile periods as well as identifying hormonal irregularities and any physical anomalies. **Sister Renee Mirkes**, a Franciscan Sister of Christian Charity, director of NaPro Ethics Center and the medical staff at the St. Paul VI Institute in Omaha, Nebraska, works with couples to investigate what is blocking the path of the sperm and eggs to be fertilized? What is causing the embryo from implanting securely in the mother’s womb? Are the woman’s hormones working properly? Are the eggs and sperm healthy, perhaps a change in diet and vitamins can enhance their viability. It is a specialized medical and surgical approach to women’s health, identifying the root causes of reproductive and gynecological issues. The beauty of this method is it aligns with Catholic teachings, cost less than IVF treatments and the percentage rate in having a baby is high.

The **St. Gianna Clinic** ([stgianniclinic.com](http://stgianniclinic.com)) is another center that focuses on healing the body naturally to achieve pregnancy rather than resorting to invasive assisted reproductive technologies like IVF. Other resources to investigate are [femmhealth.org](http://femmhealth.org) pioneered by **Dr. Pilar Vigil** and [naprotechnology.com](http://naprotechnology.com) led by **Dr. Tom Hilgers**. These centers offer a holistic approach to fertility in understanding the natural rhythms of the human body in term of procreation.

Contact **Maile** at (808) 222-0644 or [hamauloko.org](http://hamauloko.org). The more we understand our bodies, the better we can make decisions that are healthy for us. It is never too early or too old to learn about the biological functions of our own bodies as God perfectly created it.

**IVF** (Invitro Fertilization) is not recommended by the Church for it separates the unitive and procreative aspects of marital love and destroy human embryos. ***Humanae Vitae*** (encyclical by Pope Paul VI in 1968) notes the marital act of sexual intercourse must be an expression of love between the husband and wife. When technology interferes with this sacred unitive act, the marital union designed by God is lost.

In the IVF process woman's ovaries are hyper-stimulated to yield multiple eggs. The medication used to stimulate the ovary contain **FSH** (Follicle Stimulating Hormone) and **LH** (Luteinizing Hormone). These hormones stimulate the ovaries to produce multiple eggs. An average of ten to twelve eggs is harvested and fertilized with the male sperm in a laboratory petri dish. The best embryos, normally two to three, are then transferred into the woman's uterus in hope for a successful pregnancy. The remaining embryos are discarded or frozen in cryopreservation for future use. The embryos are treated as potential children and medical objects/property. This is morally wrong for all embryos are conceived and recognized as a human person with dignity.

Other forms of Assisted Reproductive Technology are **ICSI** (injecting sperm into an egg), **IUI** (intrauterine insemination), alongside third-party services like donor gametes, surrogacy and genetic testing. Surrogacy is very popular in the United States. Allowing a third-party person to carry a child to full term is a grave violation of the dignity of the human person. The Catholic Ethical and Health Directives for Catholic Health Care Services # 42 states "*Because of the dignity of the child and of marriage and because of the uniqueness of the mother-child relationship, participation in contracts or arrangements for surrogate motherhood is not permitted*". ***Donum Vitae*** (written by the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith) notes a child is a gift and the fruit of the conjugal act and is created in the image and likeness of God. It has its own dignity and rights and should be raised in a loving framework of marriage. When a new human being is born, the father, mother and child reflects the Holy Trinity, the continual love between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Catholics struggle to balance Church's teachings with contemporary values. Understanding Scripture, Tradition and the Magisterium are our compass in living a joyful, peaceful and abundant life designed to protect and bless us.

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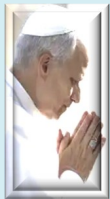
