First Reading

Acts 9:26-31

In those days: When Saul had come to Jerusalem he attempted to join the disciples; and they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple. But Barnabas took him, and brought him to the apostles, and declared to them how on the road he had seen the Lord, who spoke to him, and how at Damascus he had preached boldly in the name of Jesus. So he went in and out among them at Jerusalem, preaching boldly in the name of the Lord. And he spoke and disputed against the Hellenists; but they were seeking to kill him. And when the brethren knew it, they brought him down to Caesarea, and sent him off to Tarsus. So the church throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria had peace and was built up; and walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit it was multiplied.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

John 15:1-8

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. You are already made clean by the word which I have spoken to you. Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in me, and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. If a man does not abide in me, he is cast forth as a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you will, and it shall be done for you. By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit, and so prove to be my disciples.

ON FURTHER REFLECTION

Speaking Guardedly

In a sensitive conversation recently, I was made deeply aware that my words had as much potential to hurt as to help. I feel certain that most have experienced this particular tension. At such times it is essential not to speak too hastily or reactively. Rather, our own words have the most potential for good if they flow from our confident reliance on the Word of God.

Thinking of this, I recalled the plea of the psalmist, "Set a guard over my mouth, O LORD, keep watch over the door of my lips!" (Psalm 141:3) Especially when someone seeks and needs our counsel or support, we do well to be attuned to Divine Guidance. Only then can we be confident that what we say in response to another will be beneficial.

Too often, it seems, we engage in conversation unreflectively. That is not to suggest that there is anything wrong with casual conversation. Indeed, our God-given ability to communicate with others is one of life's richest blessings. But we have a responsibility to honor God as much by our speech as by our actions, in our words as much as in our deeds. And most of us would admit occasions of regret caused by something we have said.

The Apostle wrote: "Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for edifying, as fits the occasion, that it may impart grace to those who hear." (*Ephesians 4:29*) Perhaps the little phrase, "as fits the occasion," could be our rule. When all our words are as appropriate for a Catholic Christian to speak as they are to the situation in which we are speaking, we may be confident the Lord is guarding our mouths.
