Collect

Almighty God, who through thine Only Begotten Son Jesus Christ hast overcome death, and opened unto us the gate of everlasting life: we humbly beseech thee; that as by thy special grace thou dost put into our minds good desires, so by thy continual help we may bring the same to good effect; through the same Jesus Christ thy Son, our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

First Reading

Acts 10:34a, 37-43

In those days: Peter opened his mouth and said, "You know the word which was proclaimed throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism which John preached: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all that were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. And we are witnesses to all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and made him manifest; not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. And he commanded us to preach to the people, and to testify that he is the one ordained by God to be judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that every one who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

The Holy Gospel

John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. So she ran, and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Peter then came out with the other disciple, and they went toward the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first; and stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb; he saw the linen cloths lying, and the napkin, which had been on his head, not lying with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not know the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

Easter Day Services

After the homily, may we renew our Baptismal Promises: The people are to recite:

I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried: he descended into hell; the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence he shall come to judge the quick and dead.

Final response of the people: I will, God being my helper.

NEXT SUNDAY IS THE SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY



Eastertide begins at Easter and ends after Trinity Sunday. It is a time of uninterrupted joy and feasts, during which we celebrate the mysteries of the Resurrection, the Ascension and the Descent of the Holy Ghost on the Apostles and on His Church. The date of Easter, from which the date of all movable feasts is determined, is fixed according to the Jewish method and may vary between March 22 and April 25.

In the Liturgy of Eastertide, we commemorate the various appearance of our Lord, during which He instructed His Apostles and prepared them for the Descent of the Holy Ghost and His own Ascension.

The triumph and joy of Eastertide is reflected in the decoration of the sanctuary and the priest's use of white vestments, symbolizing joy and purity. The Paschal Candle shines in the sanctuary as a symbol of the visible presence of our Lord upon earth.

May all of us have a joyful and peaceful Eastertide.

To the Parishioners of St. Mary the Virgin,

Holy week begins, and ends with a procession. On Palm Sunday and the Vigil of Easter we move from outside the Church to inside. Our church is God's house. It is, in effect a temple, where God "lives" in the tabernacle. Processions are also reflective of our lives. We move each week from the world *into* the sanctuary where God dwells, as we offer Him our homage, our adoration, our worship, our veneration and entreat Him to hear our prayers of petition, supplication, intercession and of thanksgiving. Processions are, as one priest wrote, a "pilgrimage, of the movement from this world to the next, of the growth in Christian perfection, of movement in the Church and in our own Christian life, of Man's ultimate destiny: Heaven. Processions are essentially about moving with Christ, as a sacred community." Of all days, Easter is that special and wonderful day to renew *and* continue our spirit filled pilgrimage of faith. As Pope Benedict said, "Even if through Easter, Christ has destroyed the root of evil, he still wants the assistance of men and women in every time and place who help him to affirm his victory using his own weapons: the weapons of justice and truth, mercy, forgiveness and love."

How will you reflect the resurrected Christ in your life? How will you communicate the hope and love of Jesus within your families, at your work place or school and among your friends and enemies? How is Jesus calling on you, the unique unrepeatable person God created in his image, to serve him here in his kingdom on earth?

All this is made possible by the terrible and wonderful events of Holy Week. All this is made possible by the Cross being the throne of Christ. All this is made possible by the inexplicable empty tomb. Five weeks ago I asked God on your behalf that we all may have a holy and blessed Lent. No matter our age or station in life I hope we have prayed more, and learned in a deeper way more of our faith, of our calling in this life, so that we may lead lives of holiness in the ordinary of our lives. Jesus has broken the grip of death on mankind, and has offered the way through suffering to a peace that "passes all understanding." The Day of Resurrection is a historical fact. It is also a cosmic event that gives hope to a world sorely in need of hope and redemption. May we have a Blessed Eastertide. He is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!
