When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come forth from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. I will be his father, and he shall be my son. And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure for ever before me; your throne shall be established for ever."

The Holy Gospel

Luke 1:26-38

The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and considered in her mind what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there will be no end."

And Mary said to the angel, "How shall this be, since I have no husband?"

And the angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. Dear Friends in Christ

On the 4th Sunday of Advent, we hear the familiar story of the Angel Gabriel's announcement to Mary about the birth of Jesus. Our attention shifts today, from John the Baptist (whom we've heard about for the last two Sundays), to Mary, the mother of Jesus.

Both John and Mary serve as important figures for our reflection during the season of Advent; they both played instrumental roles in preparing the way for Christ. Last week we heard about John the Baptist's announcement that the Savior was among us, although not yet recognized. This week we reflect upon Mary's example of faith and obedience to God, traits which permitted her to receive the Angel's message that God's Son would be born as a human person, indeed, as one of us.

It is fitting that we recall how God announced the birth of Jesus as we make our final preparations for our celebra-

tion of the Incarnation. The Angel Gabriel visited Mary, a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph. Mary greeted the Angel's news with awe and wonder, and asked how it could be possible that she could give birth to a child. In his reply, Gabriel announced the seemingly impossible reality: the child to be born would be conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, and would be God's own Son. The Angel reported to Mary another miracle; her aged relative Elizabeth

was also pregnant, despite having been thought to be unable to have a child. Mary's response to the Angel, which is called her fiat, is an example of her complete faith and obedience to God.

Today's story of the Annunciation calls our atten-

tion to God's wondrous action in human history. God chose a young virgin to give birth to His Son, so that all humanity could know God's salvation. Mary, already full of God's grace (due to her Immaculate Conception), was able to cooperate in this great plan for our salvation.

Thus, Jesus was born as one of us, fully human and also fully divine. This is the mystery we prepare to celebrate at Christmas, the mystery of the Incarnation. In the model of Mary, we pray that we will be people of faith, who recognize God's saving plan for us, and are able respond, like her, with obedience.
