Reception of Holy Communion

Holy Communion at The Catholic Church of St. Mary the Virgin is received on the tongue and not in the hand. Kneeling is the appropriate posture, but if you have difficulty kneeling, please remain standing.

As the priest administers Holy Communion, he will say "The Body of Our Lord and Savior which was given for Thee; Preserve thy Body and Soul into Everlasting Life. Amen" Because the priest says "Amen," there's no need to respond "Amen" before you receive the Sacrament.

As some people may be unfamiliar with reception of communion on the tongue, here are some helpful tips:

• Make sure to open your mouth wide and put your tongue out, as it enables the priest to place

Dear Friends in Christ

While special days like Christmas and All Saints are fixed in our minds and on the calendars as December 25th and November1st, respectively, many of the important feasts of the Church's year move, based upon the date that Easter is set. The most important date in our Calendar: Easter, changes each year, moving to the Sunday after the "Paschal Full Moon," and can fall on any Sunday between March 22nd and April 25th.

In ancient times, before calendars were common, most people did not know the dates for the upcoming Liturgical year. Thus, on the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord, after the singing of the Gospel, (and the Homily), the Priest, in keeping with an ancient practice of Holy Church, announced, or "Proclaims" from the pulpit, the moveable feasts of the current year. This I did after the 8:00 am and

10:30 am masses on Sunday, and Father Kennedy did after the 1pm Mass.

Due to the (seasonably) cold weather, not all of our parishioners were able to attend mass last Sunday. For this first letter of 2022 A.D., then, I am sharing the Proclamation of Easter, Year of Our Lord 2022, using the ancient formula:

Beloved in the Lord, the glory of the Lord has shone upon us, and shall ever be manifest among us, until the day of his return.

Through the rhythms of times and seasons, let us celebrate the mysteries of salvation.

Let us recall the year's culmination, the Easter Triduum of the Lord: his Last Supper, His Crucifixion, His burial, and His rising celebrated between the evening of the Fourteenth Day of April, and the evening of the Six-

teenth Day of April, Easter Sunday being on the Seventeenth Day of April.

Each Easter -- as on each Sunday -- the Holy Church makes present the great and saving deed by which Christ has for ever conquered sin and death. From Easter are reckoned all the days we keep holy.

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, will occur on the Second Day of March.

The Ascension of the Lord will be commemorated on Thursday, the Twenty Sixth day of May.

Pentecost, the joyful conclusion of the season of Easter, will be celebrated on the Fifth Day of June.

The Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ will be celebrated on the Nineteenth Day of June

And, this year the First Sunday of Advent will be on the Twenty Seventh Day of November, 2022.

Likewise the pilgrim Church proclaims the Passover of Christ in the feasts of the holy Mother of God, in the feasts of the Apostles and Saints, and in the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed.

To Jesus Christ, who was, who is, and who is to come, Lord of time and history, be endless praise, for ever and ever.
