Scripture of the Mass

First Reading

Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

In those days: The princes said to the king, "Let this Jeremiah be put to death, for he is weakening the hands of the soldiers who are left in this city, and the hands of all the people, by speaking such words to them. For this man is not seeking the welfare of this people, but their harm."

King Zedekiah said, "Behold, he is in your hands; for the king can do nothing against you."

So they took Jeremiah and cast him into the cistern of Malchiah, the king's son, which was in the court of the guard, letting Jeremiah down by ropes. And there was no water in the cistern, but only mire, and Jeremiah sank in the mire.

Ebed-melech went from the king's house and said to the king, "My lord the king, these men have done evil in all that they did to Jeremiah the prophet by casting him into the cistern; and he will die there of hunger, for there is no bread left in the city."

Then the king commanded Ebed-melech, the Ethiopian, "Take three men with you from here, and lift Jeremiah the prophet out of the cistern before he dies."

Dear Friends in Christ:

The celebration of the Feast of the Assumption tomorrow (August 15th), refers to the Blessed Virgin Mary being **assumed**—body and soul—into Heaven at the end of her earthly life.

“**Assumption**” is different from “**Ascension**” because one is passive (i.e. one is assumed) and the other is active (i.e. one ascends).

We speak of Mary’s Assumption not her Ascension. Christ ascended via His own power, and Mary was taken up to heaven by the power of God. The Assumption of Mary is something God did for her. It is the result of Christ’s redemptive power applied to His Blessed Mother.

The dogma of the Assumption means that the Virgin Mary now experiences in Heaven the union of a glorified body and soul, which her Son enjoys. She is no disembodied spirit, but a complete human person, body and soul, matter and spirit, reigning with Christ.

Prayer for the Occasion of the Assumption

*Almighty ever-living God, who assumed the Immaculate Virgin Mary,
The Mother of your Son, body and soul into heavenly glory,
Grant we pray, that, always attentive to the things that are above,
We may merit to be sharers of her glory.*

*Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who liveth and reigneth with you
In the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
Amen*

As evidenced by the writings of many early Church fathers, Christians have believed for more than a millennium that the Blessed Virgin was assumed into heaven. In 1950, Pope Pius XII issued *Munificentissimus Deus* which officially defined the dogmas of the Assumption. This means that the Church officially recognizes this belief as a true and necessary part of our Catholic beliefs about Mary. Like all beliefs about Mary, they illuminate our most treasured beliefs about her Son.

The Assumption illustrates to the truth about Christ’s promise of eternal life and the resurrection of the faithful.

Our Feast of the Assumption, Mary’s feast, reminds us that we are created for the glory of God and to be with God for all eternity. Plan to be with us either tomorrow at noon or tomorrow night at 7 p.m. to celebrate this, our Patronal Feast.
