Scripture of the Mass

First Reading

Sirach 15:15-20

If you will, you can keep the commandments, they will save you; if you trust in God, you too shall live. He has placed before you fire and water: stretch out your hand for whichever you wish. Before a man are life and death, good and evil, and whichever he chooses will be given to him. For great is the wisdom of the Lord; he is mighty in power and sees everything. The eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, and he knows every deed of man. He has not commanded any one to be ungodly, and he has not given any one permission to sin.

Second Reading

I Corinthians 2:6-10

Brethren: Among the mature we do impart wisdom, although it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to pass away. But we impart a secret and hidden wisdom of God, which God decreed before the ages for our glorification. None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him," God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God.

The Holy Gospel

Matthew 5:17-37

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets; I have come not to abolish them but to fulfil them. For truly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. Whoever then relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches men so, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but he who does them and teaches them shall be

called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

You have heard that it was said to the men of old, 'You shall not kill; and whoever kills shall be liable to judgment.' But I say to you that every one who is angry with his brother shall be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother shall be liable to the council, and whoever says, 'You fool!' shall be liable to the hell of fire. So if you are offering your gift at the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Make friends quickly with your accuser, while you are going with him to court, lest your accuser hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you be put in prison; truly, I say to you, you will never get out till you have paid the last penny.

You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you that every one who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and throw it away; it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into hell. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away; it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body go into hell.

It was also said, 'Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.' But I say to you that every one who divorces his wife, except on the ground of unchastity, makes her an adulteress; and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

Again you have heard that it was said to the men of old, 'You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform to the Lord what you have sworn.' But I say to you, Do not swear at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. And do not swear by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. Let what you say be simply 'Yes' or 'No'; anything more than this comes from the Evil One."

Dear Friends in Christ:

Several people asked me last week why we celebrated Catholic School Week when the Catholic Church of St. Mary the Virgin does not have a Parochial School. We actually do, in a manner of speaking. We are part of a consortium of Catholic Parishes in Arlington who help support St. Joseph' School.

Here is a (very) brief history: On Wednesday, August 16, 1995, the hopes and dreams of Catholic parents in South Arlington were realized when *South Arlington Catholic School* opened its doors using the campus of St. Matthew Catholic Church. Located in Southeast Arlington, the campus at St. Matthew's housed one hundred thirty-one students. The students, representing six parishes, were enrolled to attend pre-kindergarten through second grade classes.

The present facility was opened in 1997 and the name was changed in 1998 to *Holy Rosary Catholic School*. Families were asked to make suggestions for the new school mascot to be commissioned with the renaming of the school. One family described a compelling history of the *Knights* as the protectors of the Rosary, so the school community voted to adopt the *Knights* as the new mascot of the *Holy Rosary Catholic School*.

On March 24, 2011, Bishop Kevin Vann signed a decree that established *Holy Rosary Catholic School* as a parish school of St. Joseph Catholic Church, thus the name of the school changed to *St. Joseph Catholic School*. The Catholic Church of St. Mary the Virgin has supported St. Joseph's School, both by sending students there, and assisting financially when asked.

The concept of Catholic Schools Week began in 1974. Catholic Schools Week is an annual initiative led by the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA) to celebrate the excellence and impact of Catholic schools. Each year, Catholic schools observe the celebration through a variety of activities, emphasizing the importance of Catholic education.

The theme for this year's Catholic Schools Week, 2023 is **Catholic Schools: Faith. Excellence. Service**.

Education has been an important aspect of Catholicism since the Dark Ages (between the Fall of Rome in September, 486 A.D., until the gradual establishment of Christendom in the 10th, 11th and 12th centuries, in what is now modern-day Europe) and continues to this day. Catholic Schools Week, then, celebrates the contribution that Catholic education provides to children and youth, to our Church, to our communities, and to our nation.

Although we don't have a School on Campus, I am pleased to say that we did have a robust **Parish Religious Education/Catechesis Department**. 'Catechesis' is an ancient and revered word in the Catholic Tradition. It includes both education in the faith and life-long formation in following Jesus Christ.

We also offer traditional Confraternity of Christian **Doctrine** here at St. Mary the Virgin (now commonly referred to by its abbreviation, CCD), which provides religious education to our children who attend secular schools. We also have a number of Home School families here, and our Religious Education Department assists them with Sacramental Preparation and in any way we can, as needed. Finally, we have three active Co-ops who meet here on campus regularly. The Monday one, Saint Mary the Virgin CCM Co-op meets every Monday (for younger children). Tuesday is the Cristo Rey CCM Co-op which meets every other Tuesday (for Middle School children) and the Friday one—St Newman Fellowship meets once a month (also, for younger children).
