Dear Friends in Christ:

Today is the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, also called Trinity Sunday, a feast in honor of the **Trinity**. The doctrine of the Trinity is one of the most **difficult** ideas in Christianity, but it's fundamental to Christians because it states what Christians **believe** God is **like**, and, also, who He is. Trinity Sunday, which falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost, is one of the few feasts in the Christian calendar that celebrates a **doctrine** rather than an **event**. Today is also the Sunday of our Youth Confirmations and 1st Holy Communions. Congratulations to our 31 youths who are celebrating their Confirmations and/or 1st Communions today!

The doctrine of the Trinity although a complicated (and even difficult one to understand) is **fundamental** to Christians because it is **that** dogma, on which everything **in** Christianity is based. It is in the name of the Blessed **Trinity** that all Christians are **baptized**. Only in Heaven shall we properly **understand** what it means, in union with Christ, to share as sons and daughters in the very life of God.

The actual feast of the Blessed Trinity was introduced in the Ninth Century and was only inserted in the general calendar of the Church in the Fourteenth Century by Pope John XXII. But the cultus of the Trinity is, of course, to be found throughout the liturgy. The Church causes us to praise and adore the thrice-holy God who has so shown His mercy towards us and has given us to share in His life.

The dogma of faith which forms the teaching of the feast is this: There is **one** God, and **in** this one God, there are **three** Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! The Father is not **more** God than the Son, neither is the Son **more** God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father

from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth. But we need to submit humbly and say: *Lord, I believe, help my weak faith.*

Today's celebration should make us mindful that actually **every Sunday** is devoted to the honor of the Most Holy Trinity, and that **every** Sunday is sanctified and consecrated to the Triune God.

Sunday after Sunday we should recall, in a spirit of gratitude, the gifts which the Blessed Trinity is bestowing upon us. The Father **created** us; on the first day of the week, He began the work of creation. The Son **redeemed** us; that first day of the week, Sunday, is the "Day of the Lord," the day of His Resurrection. The Holy Spirit **sanctified** us, made us His temple; on Sunday the Holy Spirit descended upon the infant Church. Each Sunday, therefore, is *the* day of the Most Holy Trinity. This is one reason why we in the Ordinariate **call** the Sundays **after** Trinity, "Trinitytide"

May Almighty God in His most Holy Trinity, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, bless each of us, this Trinity Sunday, and always.
