## The Holy Gospel

*John 6:51-58*

At that time: Jesus said to the crowds of the Jews, "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live for ever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh."

The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day. For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. ## Dear Friends in Christ:

Today is the Feast of “Corpus Christi” (No, we are not celebrating the city in Texas!) The Feast of Corpus Christi, also called Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is a festival of the Catholic Church in honor of the real presence of the body (“*Corpus*” in Latin) of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

Today is basically a celebration of the fact that the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, (and His Soul and Divinity), is present (via the miracle of transubstantiation) in the bread and wine during the Mass.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is normally celebrated on either the Thursday, or Sunday, depending on the local Bishop’s Conference, (the USCCB has determined Sunday as our day to observe the Feast) after Trinity Sunday, which falls one week after Pentecost Sunday. Since the date of Pentecost Sunday depends on the date of Easter, which changes every year, Trinity Sunday (and thus Corpus Christi) falls on a different date each year as well.

Today’s celebration is similar to the celebration we observed on Maundy (Holy) Thursday during Holy Week. Holy Thursday, though, is a solemn, somber time for the Church; it is thus impossible for Catholics to honor the Most Blessed Sacrament with appropriate solemn **and** joyful rites. Such a festival is precluded by the sad and sorrowful memories of the day — the betrayal of Judas, Christ’s agony and arrest, Peter’s denial — and by the fact that other prescribed ceremonies are already occupying the time of clergy and faithful on Holy Thursday. Corpus Christi, in contrast, allows the Church to emphasize our **joy** of the institution of the Eucharist.

Corpus Christi is observed as a public holiday in: Austria, Brazil, Bolivia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Colombia, Croatia, Dominican Republic, Haiti, East Timor, parts of Germany, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Panama, Peru, Poland, Portugal, San

Marino, parts of Spain and Switzerland, Grenada, Saint Lucia, Trinidad and Tobago.

The celebration of the Corpus Christi feast was suppressed during the Reformation in Protestant churches, and hence Protestants do not recognize or celebrate the feast. We will express our joy for the gift of the Holy Eucharist today with a Procession and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, using our newly refurbished matching gothic thuribles, at the 10:30 Solemn Mass (which is why the last mass today has been moved from 1:00pm to 1:30pm)
