All Catholics are invited to participate in our Divine Worship liturgy and receive communion by kneeling (if able) at the altar rail and receiving our Lord on the tongue.

The Holy Gospel

Matthew 19:36-10:8

Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

And he called to him his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every infirmity. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

These Twelve Jesus sent out, charging them, "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And preach as you go, saying, 'The Kingdom of heaven is at hand..' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without pay, give without pay."

Dear Friends in Christ:

With the return of summer, it's time for another edition of "Ordinariate Observances" - helpful reminders that I like to share a few times a year.

Please put your cellphone on "silent" mode when at church. Most phones will vibrate when in this mode, and all phones will keep a record of missed calls. Having a cellphone go off (no matter how popular the tune or ringtone may be) almost always serves as a (big) distraction at mass.

Please do not block the driveways of our neighbors. Public streets are just that, public, and you are free to park on them; but blocking a driveway is discourteous at best, and irksome at worst, if the offended neighbor calls the police to tow the vehicle.

Please do not applaud in church. While our organist and choir are (often) deserving of this affirmation, it is inappropriate because they sing not just to edify and inspire the congregation, but to give glory to God. In that vein, at the 10:30am and 1:00pm Masses, please stay when you can, and listen to the postlude after the final hymn. Our organist praises God with this musical ending, and it is a good way to leave the church on a happy note... (I couldn't resist)

Please do not park in the handicapped spaces in the parking lot without a special license plate or hanging placard.
