A Note From the Choir Loft:

Y'ALL COME! (Whoops, not Texan but “Britishen”) **PLEASE, COME HITHER!** The Youth Choir is producing the British story *The Reluctant Dragon* on July 28th. This little operetta (it means kind of an opera but with spoken dialogue – sort of like a musical) will feature the SMV Youth Choir acting and singing all the parts. It is not too late for your children to become a part of this by joining the Youth Choir in its Summer Choir Camp. More about this later.

The Reluctant Dragon, in its original form, is a children’s story by Kenneth Grahame, first published in 1898. On one level it is a charming tale about a dragon who prefers writing poetry to fighting; on another level it is an allegory about prejudice and reconciliation – a children’s story for all ages.

This musical adaptation was originally written as an ‘entertainment’ for The King’s Singers (six male voices) and the City of London Sinfonia to perform at a Christmas concert. The present published version, for four soloists, narrator, a few spoken characters and chorus, can be performed as a staged work.

Kenneth Graham gave the story a Christmas setting. This is not, however, essential to the narrative and has been made here by means of alternative versions of one or two passages of the text, so the piece may be performed at any time of year.

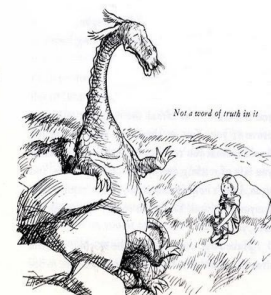
In this production, we are attempting to keep the flavor and humor of our friends “across the pond” so we are substituting our southern twang with British English (we hope) and the portrayal of a British village and

countryside. Of course, the Dragon must be British also. All of the cast is henceforth communicating with everyone with a British accent – sort of method acting – so don’t be surprised if your child sounds like the current reigning British monarch – or at least his butler.

This is a very entertaining, humorous little operetta for everyone. We have very talented children here at SMV, as you well know. So **PLEASE, COME HITHER!**
