Dear Friends In Christ:

We are fast moving towards the celebration of the Feast of Christ the King, (November 26th) and the following Sunday, (December 3rd), begins a new Liturgical Year with the First Sunday of Advent. As I have written in earlier bulletins, The month of November is dedicated to the Souls in Purgatory whom we remembered especially on All Souls Day November 2nd with a beautiful Solemn Mass set to the majestic score of Rutter's *Requiem*. (And may I again commend our choir for producing such a beautiful rendition).

At the All Souls Mass, the Church commemorates all Her faithful children who have departed from this life but have not yet attained the joys of heaven. St. Paul warns us that we must not be ignorant concerning the dead, nor sorrowful, "even as others who have no hope ... For the Lord Himself shall come down from Heaven ... and the dead who are in Christ shall rise". (1st Thessalonians vs. 13-18)

The Church has always taught us to **pray** for those who have gone into eternity. Even in the Old Testament, prayers and alms were offered for the souls of the dead by those who thought "well and religiously concerning the resurrection." It was believed that "they who had fallen asleep with godliness had great grace laid up for them" and that "it is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins." We know that a defiled soul cannot enter into heaven.

The state of Purgatory is **not** eternal. Its duration varies according to the sentence pronounced at the **particular judgment** of each individual soul. It may be prolonged for centuries in the case of the more guilty souls, or of those who, being excluded from the Catholic communion, are deprived of the suffrages of the Church, although by the Divine Mercy they have escaped Hell. But the end of the world, which will be also the end of time, will close forever the place of temporary expiation. God will know how to reconcile His justice and His goodness in the purification of the last members of the human race, and to supply by the intensity of the expiatory suffering

what may be wanting in duration. But, whereas a favorable sentence at the particular judgment admits of eternal beatitude being suspended and postponed and leaves the bodies of the elect to the same fate as those of the reprobate; at the **universal judgment**, every sentence, whether for Heaven or for Hell, will be absolute, and will be executed immediately and completely. (From *The Liturgical Year*, Abbot Gueranger O.S.B.)

Thus, the Catholic Church urges her members to pray for the souls of their departed relatives and friends, both during this month of "Holy Souls", and, indeed throughout the year. As is usually the case, the entire month of November falls during the final month of the liturgical season known in the Ordinariate as "The Sundays after Trinity" which is represented by the liturgical color Green. This color is a symbol of hope, Green is the color of the sprouting seed, and arouses in the minds of the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of Heaven, especially the hope of a Glorious Resurrection.

Why not use these last days of our Liturgical Year, to say your prayers for the Faithful Departed, and also for your **own** soul as we enter the new year with the season of Advent.

This season of Advent represents the time of our Pilgrimage to Heaven during which we hope for reward; the liturgical color changes to purple, representing for us both a time of preparation and penance.
