Scripture of the Mass

First Reading

1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19

In those days: Samuel was lying down within the temple of the LORD, where the ark of God was. Then the LORD called, "Samuel! Dear Friends in Christ:

"Stock Show Weather" is a phenomenon I've head about ever since I moved to Ft. Worth in the 1990's. it means that historically, bad weather, sometimes **awful** weather, usually accompanies this, once a year celebration of North Texas Heritage—our area whose motto is: "Where the West Begins".

A little cold weather won't be enough to derail the Stock Show and its annual parade this weekend. The parade Saturday through downtown Fort Worth has been a tradition since 1896 in the city. Saturday morning's temperature is forecast to be in the 20s, warming up to a high in the 40s for the day.

Exceptionally cold weather will follow behind a strong arctic cold front set to arrive late Saturday and Sunday. Plan for temperatures to fall to near 10 degrees or less both Sunday & Monday night, especially in North Texas.

Parade organizers are aware of the forecast and will move forward with Saturday's event, which begins at 11:00 a.m. and runs through downtown. The midway, food venders and exhibits all plan to be operating throughout the show. The 2024 Fort Worth Stock Show & Rodeo runs from Jan. 12th to Feb. 3rd at Will Rogers Memorial Center and Dickies Arena.

None of this expected weather activity phases the organizers of this year's show.

"Like we say here at the Stock Show, layer up and come have fun" said Matt Brockman, the organization's communications manager. "That's what we're gonna do." (Fort Worth Star Telegram, January 8th, 2024).

I'm impressed, but not surprised to read about this "Can Do"

attitude, so indicative of North Texans.

It is with that spirit in mind that I **urge** as **many** parishioners as **possibl**e to reassemble here at the church this afternoon at <u>3:00</u> pm to help move our old pews into the Parish Hall in preparation for the arrival and installation of our beautiful new pews tomorrow morning.

This whole new pew project should take only until Wednesday, whereupon our nave will be transformed with fresh new pews with a lovely **red upholstery**, and a wood color that **match** the **wood** on our side altars and reredos behind our High Altar.

Regular Mass Schedule will continue next week in our Parish Hall (Volunteers are also needed to help make this possible.)

As this letter has been written on Thursday, January 11th, all of this is subject to change, so please watch the website, our Facebook Page and your emails for updates.

I am confident that the "Can Do" attitude displayed by the organizers and staff If the Stock Show will be **equally matched** by the indominable spirit of our faithful parishioners.
