MISSION STATEMENT

Strengthened by our belief in Jesus Christ and trusting in God's Word, we transform our community through acts of justice by caring for the spiritual and physical needs of His people.

SCRIPTURE INSIGHTS

"My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD." In a society that valued eldest sons, god favored younger sons like Jacob or David to lead Israel. In a world hostile to foreign women, God made outsiders like Jael, Rahab, and Ruth pivotal to Israel's salvation. In a culture that inflicted fearsome penalties for betrayal, God forgave Israel repeatedly, patient for the day when his people would keep their word. God even worked to overcome Israel's self-inflicted disasters. He sent prophets to correct Israel's greedy and feckless kings and ensured that the nation would survive the damage they inflicted. These acts of mercy characterize the generous God that Isaiah speaks of in this Sunday's first reading.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus illustrates this same divine mercy in the parable of the workers in the vineyard. The daily wage for laborers was enough for a small extended family of several adults and children to purchase bread and vegetables for the day's meals with a bit left over for taxes and other expenses. Observant Jews had to be especially careful to keep enough for Sabbath days when they refrained from labor. The vineyard owner was thus making sure all his laborers could eat regardless of the work they put in. His concern was for the effects of the wage, not its value as a symbol of effort. Likewise, Jesus reveals, God's mercy is not a currency to be earned, but a gift to support the life of any who humbly ask for it.

"Conduct yourselves in a way worthy of the Gospel of Christ," Paul implores in this Sunday's second reading. The ways of the world confuse our minds. We will never understand God through logic or study. Only by trusting in Christ and living his Gospel will the truth of God's Word make any sense.

- How has living out God's ways changed your life?
- What do you think motivates the landowner to be generous, and what can his motivations teach us about God's generosity?

"'Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? [Or] am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

Matthew 20:14-16

Everything Belongs to God. Privilege refers to a right, benefit or exemption enjoyed by a particular person or group. Hard work is supposed to bring success. But we live in a world where professional football players in one year can earn more than a thousand high school teachers. The reality is that we all look for the, "hook up" the advantage and the privilege that is given to us through wealth, race, education, and social status. If we are honest, we will admit that we evaluate people by what we think they deserve. But God sees us as we really are. He gives us what we do not deserve. He freely gives His grace and favor to the humble and opposes the proud. Perhaps this is why Pope Francis defines grace in this way: "Grace is not part of consciousness; it is the amount of light in our souls, not knowledge nor reason." Grace, therefore, is a divine gift and not something we create. Our tendency is to control our own destiny, so we celebrate individual success, without recognizing that the source of the success is the grace of God.

In the first reading, the prophet in Second Isaiah issued an invitation to the desolate Israelites who were exiled in Babylon to return to God's grace. They thought that God had abandoned them. Many thought that their sins were so great that they could not be forgiven. He encouraged them to seek where God is. (v.6). Though He is directly involved in their salvation, they must repent in order o find Him (v.7). Seeking and calling on the Lord is approaching Him in confident hope, which is faith. (cf. Acts 2:21; 15:17; 17:27; 22:16; Rom. 3:11; 10:14; 2 Tim. 2:22). The person who genuinely seeks the Lord and calls on His name realizes his or her sins and is willing to turn them over to the Lord. Repentance requires abandoning our ways, thoughts, and attitudes. They are not God's ways and thoughts. (v.7). God's way is forgiveness, and His thoughts are compassionate.

Like the desolate Israelites in theses verses, we tend to blame others and even ourselves for failures, as though we are in control of the universe. Sometimes we confuse grace with race. Some proclaim their racial, social, economic and cast privileges and refuse to recognize God's grace. But our

thoughts are not God's thoughts, and our ways are often not His ways. We know that God is in control. His grace is sufficient for every circumstance. A life in Jesus Christ means that we know that our successes and failures allow us to give God glory. We have been purchased at a great price. Our lives are not our own. Everything we have belongs to God.
