



The Knights celebrated an undefeated season in their final game against Randolph High School with special thank you messages to head coach Kevin Wopat, who missed the season's final games due to COVID.

Before the Lourdes Academy Knights started their season, they hoped to join the 1974 football team as fellow state champions. In the midst of a pandemic, the season didn't play out the way they hoped, but it was noteworthy all the same.

The Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA) offered teams the option to play fall sports under a modified schedule, move them to spring, or cancel them altogether. Lourdes elected to play. The WIAA pushed the start date of the season back five weeks, thus eliminating two weeks of the regular season and three weeks of the playoffs, including the state championship game.

While the Knights missed the opportunity to become state champs, they did become the first team in school history to finish with a perfect season (9-0), and they left a trail of school records in their wake.

Quarterback Joshua Bauer ('21) became the 31st player in state history to throw for 32 or more touchdowns in a season. He also set school records by throwing 34 individual season touchdown passes, 76 career touchdown passes, and 5,704 career passing yards.

Wide receiver Preston Ruedinger ('21) also set records with 26 career receiving touchdowns, 54 single season receptions and 847 single season receiving yards.

"We were able to accomplish a lot despite covid and a schedule that was always in flux," said Lourdes Activities Director and Head Football Coach Kevin Wopat. "We played three teams that were our originally scheduled opponents out of nine games. We played six teams who finished the season with a winning record and beat two other conference champs from larger conferences."


