For bar attendants, the main thing is making sure the athlete goes off one foot and repositioning the bar if it falls. When raising the bar height with the standards make sure you measure from the middle of the bar to the ground each time. The standards can be off a little. We mainly need the 2 adults (coordinator and 1 bar Measurer) the 3rd body can be a younger helper.

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**NEW - Can NOT run back from the jump line/board to measure steps - Only run throughs

**Concern from a previous year:

I did check with the official about measuring a jump when the athlete landed toward the edge of the pit. First of all, the athlete must land in the pit. When the mark is close to the edge of the pit, the tape is read at the foul line closest to that edge, not from the center of the board.

The tape is read at the foul line. Zero is the closest mark the athlete makes to the board to the nearest 1/4 inch.

Each thrower will have the opportunity to take 4 throws.

For measuring, the zero mark is the closest mark where the implement lands. The tape is then pulled to the center of the ring and read at the foul line or board closest to the athlete. For discus measure to the nearest lesser inch and shot put to the nearest lesser 1/4 inch. A field official will be making rounds to answer questions. We like to have one person with the clipboard reading the names and measurement, one person pulling the tape and double checking the measurement reading, and 2 out in the field spotting (only one is needed for shot put in the field).

4x200m relay

The relay flags will be by the timing tent. Meet on the 200m mark on the track (northeast corner). There is only one exchange zone you will have to worry about during the 4x200m relay. Marshals should be on both the inside and outside of the track looking at the zones.

Basically, the athletes have to exchange the baton in their lane between 2 large triangles. For this relay the 1st exchange is red to red (Black line to Black line for Titan Stadium) - the next exchange is yellow to yellow.

Below is from the NFHS rule book.

- *It is the position of the BATON that is decisive; the baton must be within the exchange zone during the exchange. The position of the runners is irrelevant.
- *The exchange must be a hand-off the baton cannot be thrown between team members.
- *If the baton is dropped within the exchange zone in a genuine attempt to pass (I.e. not thrown), either runner may recover the baton (Rule 5-10-7)

4x100m relay

Divide up and each have 1 of 3 exchange zones. For this exchange all zones are yellow to yellow.
