**Why Do Catholics ...?**

**Why Do Catholics Genuflect in a Church?**

Historically speaking, the act of genuflecting on one knee comes from court etiquette and was done while in the presence of a medieval king or noble. The left knee was always used to give reverence to a king and so to distinguish the Christian usage of the custom, Christians would genuflect in church on the right knee to God. As Catholics we believe that Jesus is truly present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist and so when we genuflect, we do so because we *are* in God's presence. Bending our knees before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament fulfills what St. Paul tells us, that “*at the name of Jesus every knee should bend*” (Philippians 2:10).
