SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Today we recognize Jesus' role as Lord of all, the ruler over all humanity and the heavenly King of the eternal heavenly kingdom. To his followers, Jesus referred to this kingdom as the kingdom of his Father.

Throughout history Jesus Christ has been acknowledged as King. Even before he was born of Mary, Daniel prophesied that one like the Son of man would come from heaven to earth and be regarded as King and Lord. The author of the Book of Revelation calls him the "faithful witness of the kingdom". In the Gospel we hear Jesus witness before Pilate that he is a King.

We pray that we will be found worthy and ready for his kingdom to come into our lives as we open our hearts to the truth which continues to be revealed by Christ our Lord and Savior.

THE DIOCESAN PHASE OF THE SYNOD:

What is a Synod? Synod literally means "journeying together" or "together on the way." The purpose of a synod is to listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church through all the members of the faithful: Bishops, Priests, Deacons, Religious, Laity, young and old, those at that center of the faith community and those on the periphery. We need to listen to the Holy Spirit and listen to each other so that we may discern the path ahead.

What is this Synod About? The Title of the Synod is For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission. We are asked to consider how we journey together and how we are co-responsible for the mission of the Church. It is a synod about practicing synodality. Pope Francis put it this way: "What the Lord is asking of us is already in some sense present in the very word 'Synod.' Journeying together – laity, pastors, the Bishop of Rome – is an easy concept to put into words, but not so easy to put into practice." (Pope Francis) Deacon Peter will serve as the Official Representative for St. Stephen's Parish.

HOW HAS ST. STEPHEN'S PARISH IMPACTED MY FAITH LIFE?

Thank you to the following parishioners who have offered a personal testimony.

+ The Meyer and Marilley families have worshipped at St. Stephen's since the late 1800's. My grandmother and grandfather were married in and buried from this church. As a child, I remember traveling to 6 am Mass in Croghan and then going to the family farm for breakfast. As a family, we supported the church and the school by working in bazaars, lawn socials, the Mother's Day chicken bbq, and Sunday night bingo. We worshipped as family together, sometimes four generations in a couple pews. After Bruce and I were married at St. Stephen's, we raised our children with the same tradition: having breakfast with their Boliver grandparents and then attending Mass. They were baptized here, received the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation, and were married from St. Stephen's. Today one of my greatest joys is watching my grandsons support their faith by being altar servers at Mass. The family tradition then continues as they come to Grandma's after Mass for breakfast. St. Stephen's is the focal point of our family faith.
