

# Harden Not Your Hearts…

Are we able to see the presence of God in others? Are we able to recognize that God speaks through others? Do we see and acknowledge the prophets of our own time? Today's readings call us to open our hearts, our minds and our whole being to the presence of God in others.

The first reading today is from the Prophet Ezekiel. God sends prophets to His people. We don't always like to hear the words that a prophet speaks. On the other hand, not everyone who speaks is a prophet. The Old Testament and the New both understand clearly that a true prophet must speak according to the Word of God, and not according to the words of men.

Today many claims to be prophetic, but most lack any claims to speaking the Word of God. A true prophet in our Christian tradition must reflect both the Holy Scriptures and the Church. The Prophet Ezekiel clearly speaks the same message as the other prophets and that message is always the same: faithfulness to God's word revealed in Holy Scripture, love for God, love for others, care for the needy and the oppressed.


This message of the Scriptures remains the same from the beginning to the end of the Scriptures. The message always demands that we give up our own concerns and be concerned only for God and God's message for us. The moment we begin to seek our own good, our own enrichment, our own way of thinking—then we become unfaithful to the word of God.

The second reading today is from the Second Letter to the Corinthians. Here we also listen to God's word: "I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong." We are invited to embrace the word of Jesus Christ with all our strength and all our being. When we do embrace this word of God, we shall surely suffer and know our own weaknesses. This also is a form of prophecy because the more we embrace Christ and follow His way, the more our lives speak about God and His incredible love for us. We prophesy simply by living.

The Gospel today is from Saint Mark and takes us back to the challenge of rejection. We should remember that Ezekiel told us that it does not matter if a prophet is recognized or not. What matters is that the prophet speaks the word of God. Today's Gospel points out that we can reject a true prophet simply because we don't believe that God acts in the ordinary events of our lives and in seemingly ordinary people.

God is always speaking to us: in others, in the events of our lives, in the Church, and in our world. In order to understand God, we must be attentive first of all to His revealed word. When that revealed Word is our whole way of living, then we begin to recognize His word in all the other realities of our lives. Today God invites us: listen to the prophets! Open your hearts and minds and beings! God loves you and wishes to speak with you. Harden not your hearts today!

This Sunday the Catholic Church in Australia will celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday, marking the beginning of NAIDOC Week 2021. This year's theme explores the various ways in which our country needs healing: environmentally, socially, and spiritually. It's something not lost on Pope Francis, who in Laudato Si' advocates for Indigenous communities to become 'principal dialogue partners' in caring for the earth and its inhabitants.

#### **Previous Popes**

In 1970, Pope Paul VI visited Australia and from Sydney addressed the nation as a whole, including its Indigenous inhabitants. To them he said:

We know that you have a lifestyle proper to your own ethnic genius or culture – a culture which the Church respects and which she does not in any way ask you to renounce.

Fundamental to recognising the catholicity of the Church, its universal quality, is respecting the many cultures that constitute her. That which is *positive* in a culture is never expected by the Church to be left at the door. On the contrary, Pope Paul VI went on with strong words:

... the common good never can be used legitimately as a pretext to harm the positive values of your way of life.

In other words, the beauty and the goodness of one's culture should be drawn out, highlighted and celebrated. Any attempt on the part of the others to try and efface that in the name of the common good – in the name of anything, really – is *wrong*.

When Pope John Paul II visited Australia in 1986, he echoed the words of Paul VI but also pointed out some particularities of Indigenous culture that would later feed into Pope Francis' reflections in *Laudato Si'*. This has to do with the relationship between people and the land. Pope John-Paul II said this:

For thousands of years this culture of yours was free to grow without interference by people from other places. You lived your lives in spiritual closeness to the land, with its animals, birds, fishes, waterholes, rivers, hills and mountains. Through your closeness to the land you touched the sacredness of man's relationship with God, for the land was the proof of a power in life greater than yourselves. You did not spoil the land, use it up, exhaust it, and then walk away from it. You realized that your land was related to the source of life (§4).

It is precisely this approach to the land that Pope Francis picks up in *Laudato Si'*, urging us to reframe our relationship to the earth using a basic principle of Catholic Social Teaching.

"As the Lord spoke to me, the spirit entered me and set me on my feet, and I heard the one who was speaking say to me, 'Son of man, I am sending you...'" EZEKIEL 2:2-3

God has a plan for each of us. He calls us to do something for Him. But, He doesn't leave us on our own to figure it out. He gives us the resources we need to do His work. Are you listening for God's call? When you hear it, do you get on your feet and do the work He asks of you? Do not be afraid. God doesn't call the equipped, he equips the called. Answer His call.
