

We remember & celebrate how Christ has taken the symbol of torture & death and turned it into a symbol of victory & triumph, life & salvation. Do you have a Cross in your home? Is it one of those sweet, golden, ones covered in flowers or more like the true Cross covered in the blood of your saviour? This would be a great day to celebrate the feast by venerating the Cross in your home. Think of what we do on Good Friday and try to imitate that.

I adore You, O Christ, and I praise You, Because by Your Holy Cross, You have redeemed the world.

The power of the Cross doesn't end 15 until we also honor the Mother of Jesus who though she was born without the stain of original sin, she was not saved from the scourge of suffering. This feast, Our Lady of Sorrows commemorates the great sufferings that Mary experienced in her life alongside her son Jesus. Tradition & the Bible give us 7 Sorrows, they are as follows (look them up in the Bible): {1} The Prophecy of Simeon (Lk 2:25-35); {2} The Flight into Egypt (Mt 2:13-15); {3} The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple in Jerusalem (Lk 2:41-51); {4} The meeting of Jesus and Mary on the Way of the Cross (Lk 23:26-31); {5} The Crucifixion (Jn 19:17-18, 25-30); {6} The Removal of Jesus' Body from the Cross (Mk 15:43-47); {7} The Burial of Jesus (Jn 19:39-42).

A good way to celebrate, may include of meal that is both sweet & sour and of course of 7-Up. Father hopes to visit a replica of the Pieta statue at the Cathedral in Boise.
