

PASTOR'S NOTES

A D-I-Y Study on this Sunday's Readings

The Christian belief in the Trinity, that God is eternally one, yet in a relationship of three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is truly a mystery. That three distinct persons are also one - not metaphorically but truly – stretches our minds. Yet we should not be surprised that the nature of the infinite God is bigger than our human brains can easily comprehend. Part of the glory of Heaven will be receiving knowledge of who God is in himself, a mystery that we will never cease to find amazing. Just as a new parent can stare endlessly at the face of their child, so we will never tire of beholding God.

"Since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ..." What does it mean to be "justified" before God? To be justified is to have our relationship with God set right again. Sin distances us from God and sets us against Him. To be justified by faith means that our relationship with God is healed when we set commit (or recommit) ourselves to serve him. To have "faith" in this way means that we place ourselves at God's service as His disciples. In what ways have you put yourself in the service of God? Where do you hold yourself back?

"... affliction produces endurance, and endurance, proven character, and proven character, hope..." We all do what we can to avoid suffering, yet we also know that sometimes our struggles have made us substantially stronger. Without the struggles life gives us, we might never have grown wise or mature. In fact, maturity makes us stable enough to bear many burdens for the people that we love, when otherwise we could have done no such service to them. In this way, we can become grateful for the ways our sufferings have transformed us. Sometimes our struggles make us strong, and sometimes we just become bitter. If you see bitterness in your heart, how can you bring it to the God who heals?

"... hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit." Hope, a "theological virtue" along with faith and love, are gifts from the Holy Spirit. Yet here we read that hope also requires the foundation of our good character. Hope is that inner strength like and anchor within our soul, that keeps us holding onto God's promises through our trials. The hope of God's glory is not an illusion. It holds onto God's promises, "who does not deceive nor can be deceived." (CCC 156) What parts of your character make you weak against the trials or temptations that come to you?



UPCOMING EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION The feast of Corpus Christi next Sunday (June 19) will inaugurate a three year "Eucharistic Revival" by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops. This Revival is meant to elevate our love for Jesus Christ and the Eucharist. Since the 13th century, one of the ways to honor the Eucharist is by processing the Blessed Sacrament through the streets, publicly demonstrating our love and adoration of Our Lord in the Eucharist. Our parishes will conduct a Eucharistic Procession together from Holy Rosary to bless the LaMoure County courthouse, representing the people of our county. (This will also require swapping our Mass times that Sunday morning, with 9:00am at St Raphael and 11:00am at Holy Rosary).
