


PASTOR'S NOTES

A D-I-Y Study on this Sunday's Readings

This Sunday we read the close of St Paul's letter to the Galatian Christians. His theme in the letter has been the freedom that Christians are promised by Christ: freedom from many of the regulations of the Jewish Law, as well as the inner freedom of our conscience, with the weight of guilt lifted from us through the blood of Christ. Therefore the Blood of Christ does not give us freedom to treat others however we want. To believe that would be lunacy. Christ's sacrifice sets us free to love each other sacrificially in the way Christ did. *"For freedom, Christ set us free."*

"May I never boast except in the Cross of our Lord, Jesus Christ." How much time and energy do we spend trying to find reasons to feel good about ourselves? We think our income level, our family line, our circle of friends (or we could find most anything for a reason) makes us superior to other people. St Paul gives us the example that a Christian should find that the love of God alone, revealed in the sacrifice he made on our behalf, is enough to make us feel like we are enough. *What about the cross is worthy to boast about?*

"The world has been crucified to me and I to the world." "The world" is where we usually seek our value. If other people like us, we feel good enough. If our neighbors think we have our lives put together, then I have nothing to fear. Unfortunately, living behind a mask in that way can make our true selves whither inside. This is no less true for children than it is for adults! *How much do you let the approval of "the world" drive you? Do you regularly stretch the truth (about your job, your weekend, etc.) to make yourself look more appealing or exciting to other people?*

"Peace and mercy to all who follow this rule." One aspect of the "new life" Jesus promises us is in the freedom from superficial lives. However, living real and honestly requires courage! When Jesus sent out his 72 disciples to try their hands at preaching, he warned them, *"I am sending you as lambs among wolves."* Courage is found when we love. We will do whatever it takes to preserve our relationship with someone we love! *What courageous thing is Jesus asking you to do right now to build your relationship with him?*


