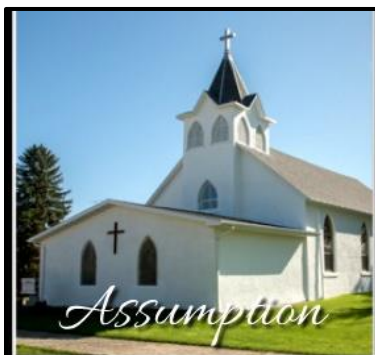

PASTOR'S NOTES

A D-I-Y Study on this Sunday's Readings

The familiar parable of the "Good Samaritan" is proclaimed this Sunday. Most of us can probably recall the gist of the parable without having to look it up: a poor, man, violently robbed and beaten, is lying by the side of the road needing help. Several people pass by including a priest of the Temple, without helping him until someone finally willing to help sees the man and nurses him back to health.

"But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight." Every parable has several layers of meaning and application. Here, one clear application is that we should all be willing to stop, even in the middle of our pressing errands, and help someone we see in need. That is a correct - and difficult - application of Jesus' words. *How often do I use my own busyness as an excuse to disregard other peoples' pressing needs?*

"Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" Another layer of meaning, deeper than the first, is that we are all, in some way, like the helpless man on the street. We are all wounded by other people and by the consequences of our own sin. Jesus picks us up, bathes us with the oil and wine of the sacraments, and carries us to the inn of the Church where we are nursed back to health. *How much do I make use of the "medicine" offered through the Church: the healing grace of the sacraments and the community organized around my parish?*

"The [Samaritan] who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, **"Go and do likewise."** Yet another layer of meaning is often lost on us, though it would have been glaringly obvious to Jesus' listeners. In fact, this is the most direct meaning of the parable. The "Good Samaritan" is not just another guy. He is a member of the despised people of Samaria. He was a foreigner (which would have been bad enough) and a corruptor of the Jewish culture and religion. By default of his birth, the Jews would have looked down on him and assumed he could do nothing good. *How much do I put people in my own clean categories and make assumptions about the good they can or cannot do? How much do I think I am better than another because of my skin color, education level, economic class, or my profession?*
