PASTOR'S NOTES

A D-I-Y Study on this Sunday's Readings

Jesus is known for his use of images and applications when he preached. Sometimes those examples can be difficult to connect to because we live in a different time and place, and they've always demanded a little imagination. But a little reflection can open our minds to them as well. "Salt" and "light" are as common to us as they were to those listening to Jesus when he said the words of today's Gospel. (We may not use oil lamps to light the evening, but we still need our electric lamps!) How do these analogies apply to you?

"You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned?" Proper salting makes bland food delicious, yet in itself it adds little flavor. Instead, it enhances the flavors already there. Grace is similar. It doesn't make us more than human - it makes us the most human. We become what we should be. What am I more influenced by, the values of the Gospel or the values of the world? Whose favor do I seek, Jesus' or the culture's?

"You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden." Light is one of the most necessary things in our lives, yet it is also most overlooked. We never think of the light we are seeing, but we see the things the light illumines. Grace similarly draws our attention to the people and the concerns in the heart of God. Sometimes we forget to ask God to lead us. Before the end of the day, stop and ask God to guide you by the inner light he gives.

"Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." As disciples, we must try to walk what can sometimes be a delicate balance between letting ourselves be good examples to others, while not seeking their admiration. This is what is required of any good mentor. We show others the way and give what we have, without making it about ourselves. Who likely looks to you as a leader or mentor? How can you be a better example to them with your gifts and your faith?


