Getting our Priorities & Plans Straight for Feb. 14th

This year, Lent is starting on February 14th (Ash Wednesday). Regarding Saint Valentine's Day. which falls on February 14th, the love of neighbor, even if one's spouse or boyfriend/girlfriend, should either spring from a higher love of God or lead to a greater love of God. Let's treat our spouse or, if single, our significant other of the opposite sex on the day or night (Feb. 13th) before Ash Wednesday, which is feted as Carnival or Fat Tuesday ("Mardi Gras" in French) in New Orleans and many countries.

Mass schedule: 8 a.m. (Ordinary Form) and 11:30 a.m. (Extraordinary Form, with confessions 10:45-11:15) at **Sacred Heart.** 6:30 p.m. (Ordinary Form) at **Presentation.** Ash Wednesday is a **fast day** (i.e., one full meal and two smaller collations with nothing solid in between except for medicine) for all Catholics ages 18 to 59 inclusive, although our elders and children are urged to make the sacrifice. For all Catholics age 14 and up, this day too is a day of abstinence from all meats (e.g., beef, poultry, lamb, veal, pork, venison, etc.) and all broths, soups, and sauces made from or with meat.




