The practice of prayer and meditation in modern Western Christianity is rooted in the Eastern tradition of early Church prayer as well as the wisdom of early Church fathers. In Centering Prayer, M. Basil Pennington, returns to these roots, offering contemporary Christians a new approach to ancient prayer forms.

Pennington combines the best of the Eastern spiritual exercises (such as the Jesus Prayer) with a spirituality for today's world. Addressing the obstacles that discourage people from praying well, he explains how to relax for prayer, how to listen to and be directed by the Other, and how to handle the pain and distractions that can stifle attempts to communicate with God.

Bye, bye Miss America Pie...the day the music died: Remembering Charlie Kirk

On September 10, I was traveling to Tampa, Florida to attend the National Association of Diaconate Directors (NADD) board meeting. As the board member representing Region 9 (Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, and Iowa) of the USCCB, I have the responsibility to communicate the "state-of-the-diaconate" for my region. I was in between flights when I heard the news that Charlie Kirk had been shot by a would-be assassin. After I landed in Tampa, I learned that he had died.

Charlie Kirk, 31-years old, was a good Christian man, a husband, and a father of two young children. A conservative man having high moral character. He was always willing to debate those who had a different view but without belittling them. His hope was to help them to think for themselves, to see things differently in the hope of changing their hearts and minds.

It was just 24 years earlier, on September 11, 2001, that the world changed due to an attack on the U.S. from a terrorist nation. The attack shook us to the core. American's rallied and came together. We put political differences aside and united ourselves in a common bond of faith, freedom, and liberty.

On September 10, 2025, America was changed again. This time for the worse, because the evil came from within. Kirk, a rare, young, new and generational leader, was murdered for having vision of an America that focused on returning to conservative Christian values. A return to faith, family, and moral living. He desired to end division, violence and hatred. He envisioned an America where public discourse can be freely and peacefully debated; to bring about independent thinking and rejecting today's extreme ideologies.

One of Kirk's dear friends, Gia Chacon, had this to say about Charlie in an article she wrote for "National Catholic Reporter".

"As a Catholic, I cannot look at Charlie's assassination and stop at grief because that can lead to despair. Our faith teaches that suffering, even when it seems senseless, can bear fruit." Chacon went on to referenced Tertullian, an early writer of the Church, quoting, "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church." Charlie was not a martyr in the technical sense, but his life and his death will not be wasted. It is my hope that his legacy and voice will shape generations to come.

Ironically, Kirk was asked just a few months ago how he would want to be remembered upon his death. He responded, "I want to be remembered for courage for my faith. That would be the most important thing. The most important thing is my faith."

After the senseless shooting at Annunciation Catholic Church in Minneapolis last month, Kirk was asked if there is a God, why is there evil in the world? He responded, "The cross is God's answer to evil. The question should not be 'why does evil exist?' Instead, it should be 'what has God done about it?' And the cross is the answer."

Throughout his career, Kirk encouraged young people to get married and start families, argued against abortion and gender ideology, and worked to inspire college students to follow Christ.

Charlie's death is a warning of how far our country has strayed. But it is also a call to action; to live with the courage he exemplified, to speak truth without fear and, to bring faith into public life without apology. Charlie's life demands this of us. And it may be the only answer that can save this nation.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Before I was a priest, I was a lazy worker for a retail Apple store. Hearing a rumor that my boss was going to fire me, I secretly sold iPhones for half-price, gave away dozens of free iPads, and donated several brand-new laptops to managers in other stores in the mall. After a week, my boss called me into his office. He knew what I was up to. He said I had cost the store thousands of dollars. "Really great work, John," he said. "I am going to recommend you to be my assistant manager and double your pay." I was amazed.

And so are you. Which is understandable because it never happened. How could it? My tall tale is a retelling of Jesus' brow-furrowing parable we hear this week. A lazy, dishonest steward defrauds his boss and then the "master commended the dishonest servant for acting prudently" (Luke 16:8). What is the Lord saying to us?

Most of us treat our spiritual lives like a lazy teenager at an Apple store. We really don't care. We go through the motions. Then, if we are lucky, something happens that shakes us to spiritual action; to employ whatever time, money, and resources we have to build around us a strong network of love. Every saint did that. Our Lord is so good he wants us to use his stuff to forgive debts and to bless others. He wants us to ensure our future. So do it!






