

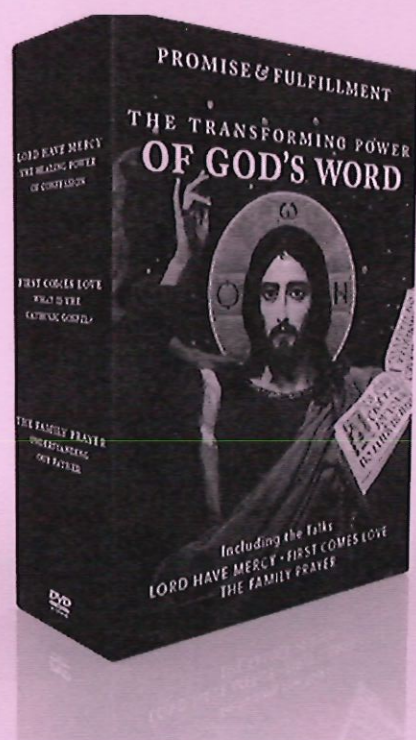


Will show the short 12-16 minute videos after 8 & 10am Masses each week
