MEDITATION

Resurrection is a central tenet of the Christian faith. When he rose after three days in the tomb, Jesus showed that he had defeated death once and for all. His resurrection is also the basis for our belief that we too shall overcome death and rise again. Moreover, as Paul tells us in the second reading, Christ’s resurrection transforms our life today, empowering us to reject sin and live in righteousness.

The story of Lazarus demonstrates that resurrection is not restricted to Jesus alone. In order to make this clear, Jesus delayed going to see his sick friend, with the result that by the time Jesus arrived, Lazarus had been dead for four days. This reminds us of Jesus’ own resurrection after three days.

In the Bible, three days often symbolizes the time span during which things are within human control, but beyond three days only God can act. By delaying his arrival, Jesus made sure that he would not be healing a sick man but rather raising a dead man. He also reinforced that this was the result of God’s intervention.

Every time we gather, we celebrate Jesus’ death and resurrection in the Eucharist. We also proclaim it aloud when we recite the Mystery of Faith, affirming his death, his resurrection and his return in glory, when we too shall rise from the dead.

ANNIVERSARY TRIVIA:

Brantford became a mission of Dundas on December 1, 1840. In 1841 a large white frame building was built on the site of Lot # 2 on Crown St. The mission contained the township of Flambro, East and West Beverly, Dumfries, Hamilton (not the town), Ancaster, Dundas and Indiana (in the 1840’s Indiana was a thriving settlement on the Grand with 300 residents, many Irish Catholics enabling it to form its own parish – St. Rose of Lima).

This mother of three in Haiti was one of the chief engineers on a project led by our partner ITECA to build new houses after the 2010 earthquake. Thanks to the project, Ismene was trained in how to make reinforced masonry and other skills. The project employed 600 workers and tradespeople, and 800 houses were built. When hurricane Matthew hit Haiti in October 2016, only one home was damaged by the 200 km/hr. winds!
