

Welcome to Transfiguration

Welcome to Transfiguration of Our Lord Parish, a personal parish of the Diocese of Syracuse, serving Christ's Faithful under the care of Father James A. Schultz and Pastor Emeritus Father Thomas Kobuszewski. Here at Transfiguration you will rediscover a profound sense of the Sacred as the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered reverently with beautiful sacred music and love – all for the greater glory of God. We offer both the Traditional Latin Mass and the English Mass 'Ad Orientem;' where the priest and people physically orient themselves in the same direction. The reality of what is happening is more clearly expressed when the Mass is offered this way, as the priest and congregation are not in dialogue with one another but are together offering their prayers and Christ's sacrifice to God the Father.

Our Parish Community has been rapidly growing over the last year as more and more people are rediscovering the treasure of our Catholic Heritage. Do not feel out of place if you are not familiar with Latin (you will see most people reading their Missals) or if the actions on the altar look different. Many people who have never attended a Traditional Latin Mass have concerns about what to expect from the experience. However, the purpose of both forms of the Roman Rite are the same - to give glory to God through adoration, contrition, thanksgiving and supplication as expressed through the liturgical prayers and actions of the priests during the Mass. The parishioners and priests at Transfiguration are friendly and welcoming, so feel free to ask questions about the Catholic faith as well as elements of the Latin Mass that may be confusing or different from your regular Mass experience.

Sacrament Information

The Sacrament of Baptism.

Parents submit request, including baptismal date requested, to the Parish office. Baptismal Data Sheet and Godparent forms required. Godparents must be baptized, confirmed and active Catholics (go to Mass weekly, etc.).

The Sacrament of Marriage.

Diocesan policy requires initial contact with the church at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date. To begin marriage preparation, including required classes you will need to contact the Office.

Anointing of the Sick.

Members facing surgery, serious illness, or even death may call the office. Never wait, never hesitate & remember: physical healing can also be an effect of the sacrament. Don't deprive a loved one of God's help.

On <u>Thursday</u>, <u>February 2nd at 6PM</u>, the Most Reverend Bishop Douglas J. Lucia will be celebrating the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass here at Transfiguration of Our Lord Parish for the <u>Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, more commonly known as Candlemas</u>. With hopeful anticipation we believe even more people will attend the Bishops Mass this year. Please extend an invitation to all of your friends and family.

To prepare for this celebration we will be having another family fun Candle Making Party & Potluck after the 11:15AM Latin Mass on Sunday, January 29th, downstairs in the Parish Hall. We hope you consider joining us again, as last years candle making party was a great success and fun for all ages. Please bring a dish and/or refreshments to share as this will be a potluck style meal just like last years. Be sure to look for our spiritual bouquet sign up sheet on one of the tables in the Parish Hall during the party, that you and your family can sign for the Bishop. The goal is to make a candle for every member of the Parish, from young to old to be blessed by the Bishop. As an act of charity and a way for our community to come together, we will be hand making around 300+ beeswax candles at the party, to be blessed by our Bishop at Candlemas.

This year we will have more beeswax wrap candles. These are great for little ones of the Parish to avoid the hot wax, but children as young as 3 were able to make hot beeswax candles last year with no problem. If you are able, please make extra beeswax wrap candles for those who will be visiting on February 2nd and for the families of our Parish that are unable to attend the party – these candles only take a few minutes to make. Candles will be labeled and kept downstairs. They will be brought upstairs to be blessed by Bishop Lucia on February 2nd, and can be picked up after the Mass and lit in all moments of danger, during thunderstorms, during sickness, and in times of tribulation.

WE NEED VOLUNTEERS! We need all hands on deck for set up, help during, and clean up for both the party and for decorating the Church for Candlemas – men, women and children! *We also plan to have refreshments and cookies after Candlemas downstairs in the Parish Hall and will need help setting this up as well. If you would like to volunteer, we plan to have a meeting after the First Saturday Mass, January 7th in the rectory conference room from 10-11AM. Men's Group.



Mass Intentions.

- The Mass schedule for 2023 is now open. To ensure that all parishioners have an opportunity to have the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered for their intentions, and that space is available for Masses for the recently deceased, we are going to introduce a new system for Mass offerings. At this stage Parishioners are invited to request a **maximum** of 3 Masses for the **year 2023**. The Mass schedule will then be opened for each quarter and parishioners have another opportunity to request Masses each quarter.
- Please send in your <u>3 intentions</u>/names for 2023 along with the dates and your Mass stipend, using the pew envelopes. We will do our best to fulfill, as close to the requested date as possible. Dates can be selected from the entire year.
- * Once parishioners have had an opportunity to submit these <u>3 intentions</u> and they are added to the Mass book, the Mass Schedule will be opened again for the first quarter (January to April) and you will have another opportunity to have additional Masses offered, depending on availability.
- * <u>Mass Requests</u> Pew envelopes are available for your requests, \$10 per Mass stipend.

Last year we were inundated with requests for Masses and, while this is a happy complaint, we were not able to accommodate all of the parishioners. We are hoping this new approach will be as fair as possible.
