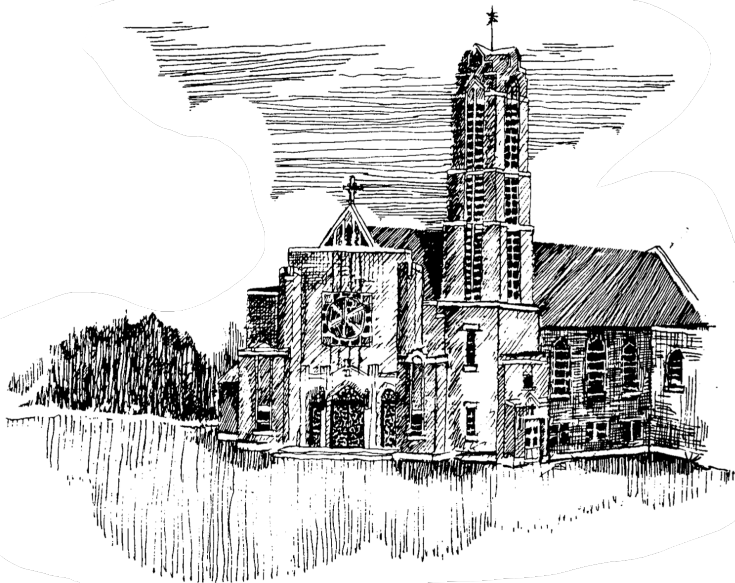


THE CANDLE MAKING PARTY & POTLUCK IS TODAY!

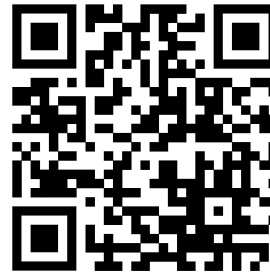

Welcome to Transfiguration

Welcome to Transfiguration of Our Lord Parish, a personal parish of the Diocese of Syracuse, serving Christ's Faithful under the care of Father James A. Schultz and Pastor Emeritus Father Thomas Kobuszewski. Here at Transfiguration you will rediscover a profound sense of the Sacred as the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered reverently with beautiful sacred music and love – all for the greater glory of God. We offer both the Traditional Latin Mass and the English Mass 'Ad Orientem;' where the priest and people physically orient themselves in the same direction. The reality of what is happening is more clearly expressed when the Mass is offered this way, as the priest and congregation are not in dialogue with one another but are together offering their prayers and Christ's sacrifice to God the Father.

Our Parish Community has been rapidly growing over the last year as more and more people are rediscovering the treasure of our Catholic Heritage. Do not feel out of place if you are not familiar with Latin (you will see most people reading their Missals) or if the actions on the altar look different. Many people who have never attended a Traditional Latin Mass have concerns about what to expect from the experience. However, the purpose of both forms of the Roman Rite are the same - to give glory to God through adoration, contrition, thanksgiving and supplication as expressed through the liturgical prayers and actions of the priests during the Mass. The parishioners and priests at Transfiguration are friendly and welcoming, so feel free to ask questions about the Catholic faith as well as elements of the Latin Mass that may be confusing or different from your regular Mass experience.

Sacrament Information

The Sacrament of Baptism.

Parents submit request, including baptismal date requested, to the Parish office. Baptismal Data Sheet and Godparent forms required. Godparents must be baptized, confirmed and active Catholics (go to Mass weekly, etc.).

The Sacrament of Marriage.

Diocesan policy requires initial contact with the church at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date. To begin marriage preparation, including required classes you will need to contact the Office.

Anointing of the Sick.

Members facing surgery, serious illness, or even death may call the office. Never wait, never hesitate & remember: physical healing can also be an effect of the sacrament. Don't deprive a loved one of God's help.

UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT FOR THE NORTHERN DISTRICT OF NEW YORK

In re The Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse, New York, Case No. 20-30663

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT, On June 19, 2020, The Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse, New York, ("Diocese") filed for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code").

The court has established January 17, 2023 at 11:59pm (prevailing Eastern Time) (the Supplemental Bar Date") as the deadline to assert claims against the Diocese arising from or relating to assert claims against the Diocese arising from or relating to abuse that occurred when the survivor was 18 years of age or older, and which, prior to the enactment of the Adult Survivors Act (S.66A/A.648A) would have been subject to a statute of limitations defense ("Adult Claims").

If you have an Adult Claim against the Diocese you must file a claim on or before the Supplemental Bar Date, which will be treated confidentially in accordance with the prior court orders in the Case.

IF YOU DO NOT TIMELY FILE A PROOF OF CLAIM, YOU MAY FORFEIT YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE ON ANY PLAN OF REORGANIZATION AND TO SHARE IN ANY DISTRIBUTIONS TO CREDITORS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DIOCESE'S CHAPTER 11 CASE.
