

FEAST OF ST. HUBERT


Friday, November 3rd is First Friday and the Feast of St. Hubert, the patron saint of hunters. There is a traditional blessing of bread on his feast day. You can bring your fresh baked (or store bought) bread to the 6:30AM, 10AM, or 6:30PM Masses and it will be blessed after Mass.

ALL SOULS ENVELOPE

Envelopes to remember the souls in purgatory on the Feast of All Souls are available in the vestibules. Please write the names of your deceased family and friends on the envelopes and put them in the collection basket. You may write as many names as you wish and may also include a slip with additional names inside the envelope. These envelopes will be placed on the altar for the entire month of November (The Month of the Poor Souls in Purgatory) and will be remembered at each Mass during the Month. You can submit as many additional envelopes as you wish during November.

FATHER-SON @MMUNION BREAKFAST

In an effort to integrate the Blessed Sacrament into our family lives and strengthen the rich spiritual bonds between parents and their children, we are instituting Communion Breakfasts where a parent and children attend a Saturday Mass together and then attend a breakfast in the basement afterwards. There will be a talk by one of the priests on the family and related subjects. The first Communion Breakfast will be a Father-Son Communion Breakfast on Saturday November 18th at the 9AM Mass. Fathers and sons of any age can join this celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and breakfast. The Cost is \$5.00 per family and reservations can be made through the office. The Mother-Daughter Breakfast will follow in January.



Plenary Indulgences:

CHRIST THE KING

A Plenary Indulgence can be attained by faithful Catholics who, on the *Feast of Christ The King:*

- Publicly recite the Prayer of Dedication of the Human Race to Jesus Christ the Sovereign King, (prayer will be included in next weeks bulletin)
- Recite one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the intentions of the Holy Pontiff
- Are free from attachment to sin, and have received the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion within the Octave.

THE SOULS IN PURGATORY

A Plenary Indulgence can be attained each day from <u>Nov</u> <u>1-8</u> for a Soul in Purgatory by faithful Catholics who:

- Make a good Confession and receive Holy Communion within a week of All Souls Day
- Are free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin
- Visit a cemetery and pray for the dead and then say one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the Holy Pontiff.
- A plenary Indulgence can also be gained for the Poor Souls by visiting a church or chapel on November 2nd.

Parishioners,

In August, I was assigned here full time and Fr. Belling was assigned here for 1/2 of his time (St. Mary's Oswego for the other half). This means we went from 'one half a priest' to 'one and a half' a priest. With three priests, Fr Tom as well, we are honored to be here as your priests. However, this change from half a priest to one and a half a priest costs around \$45,000. In addition, the Diocesan assessments (for example; insurance costs for parish, Catholic schools, etc) all increased this year totalling \$15,000 in new costs. If we add these together, these new 'fixed' costs are around \$60,000. This is a significant increase in 'fixed' costs for our church.

If we all come together, we can rise to this occasion and meet our needs. To be sure, I know we only have so many parishioners who already give so much. I am so grateful. I did the math and we have been averaging \$5,700 dollars per week for the past two months. I am super happy about that. Nonetheless our new situation has prompted me to invite you to help our parish. A few thoughts: Are you able to tithe? Would you consider it? If everyone examines their giving, would we all be able to make an increase each week? Are there some who would be willing to make larger donations for projects at the Church? Do you have friends that come occasionally, but strongly support our Latin Mass mission?

At the last parish council meeting, it was suggested that we should first ask God for help. If I may, I am inviting everyone to do a 54 rosary novena for our parish. It begins on All Souls day, November 2nd and ends on December 25th. I have identified some things we could pray for: Unity and friendship at a our parish, enthusiasm for our faith, each person and each family, the poor souls, Bishop Lucia and Pope Francis, our priests Devotion to The Blessed Mother - families dedicated to the family rosary, Our financial needs, miracles, help with our efforts to beautify parts of the church, our neighborhood, world peace and yes your needs!

Truly, we are a blessed parish in so many ways. We have so much. I could write pages about what we have - our beautiful campus, marble walled church, beautiful music, families and children, the Latin Mass, our co-op, our faith formation, our people. Thank you for considering the questions I posed. We are aiming for \$8,000 per week. Mark your calendar and let us make it a great 54 day rosary with many souls participating.


