

Have mercy on all people, most merciful Jesus, and draw them to Your Sacred Heart. Be King, O Lord Jesus, not only of the faithful who have never forsaken You, but also of the prodigal children who have abandoned You; grant that they may quickly return to the Almighty Father's house, lest they die of wretchedness. Be King, Lord Jesus, of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions or whom discord keeps aloof and call them back to the harbor of truth and the unity of faith, so that soon there may be but one flock and one Shepherd--You, Lord Jesus. Grant, O Lord Jesus, to Your Holy Catholic Church and to Your flock assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give tranquility of order to all nations; make the earth resound with one cry: "Praise to the Sacred Heart that wrought our salvation; to the Lord Jesus be glory and honor for ever and ever". 

PARISH PURGATORY CRUSADE

As we enter the month of Holy Souls, we are embarking on an effort to keep the departed family and friends of our parishioners in our prayers throughout the liturgical year. The Transfiguration Purgatory Crusade will be a way to have your departed remembered in Requiem Masses throughout the year, beginning on November 1, 2023 until Oct 31, 2024. You will find large white Holy Souls envelopes available for you to enroll your departed family and friends in the vestibule starting on All Souls day. The smaller all souls envelopes may also still continue to be used. Father has decided that instead of just leaving these envelopes on the altar for just the month of November as previously stated, they will remain on the altar all year. You can include as many souls on the envelopes as you wish and you may include a donation of any amount in the envelope as you wish. Please write your name as the enrollment sponsor and your email address and we will send you the Novena of the Holy Souls. This can be offered by you and your family as often as you wish throughout the year. Your enrollment envelope will remain on the altar all year and those souls will be remembered during the Purgatory Crusade Masses throughout the year. We expect to say 25 Masses this year for the dead here at Transfiguration with 25 rosaries.



In August I was assigned here full time and Fr. Belling was assigned here for 1/2 of his time (St. Mary's Oswego for the other half). This means we went from one half a priest to one and a half priests. This addition from half a priest to one and a half a priest costs approximately \$45,000. In addition, the Diocesan assessments, insurance costs for parish, Catholic schools, have all increased this year totaling \$15,000 in new costs. This does not include our Hope Appeal commitment which I will discuss at another time.

These new costs are \$60,000. This is a significant increase in fixed costs for our church, costs we have to pay each month just to keep the church going. I am so grateful to all of you who have supported this parish. We have been averaging \$5,700 dollars per week in collections for the past two months. Thank you! These new costs have prompted me to invite you to help our parish. My goal for weekly collections is \$8000.00. This will help us meet these new costs, any future increases and accomplish many of the projects here at the church.

I am prayerfully asking you to consider these questions:

- Are you able to tithe?
- Would you consider tithing to Transfiguration Parish on a regular basis?
- Are you able and willing to make larger donations for projects at the Church?
- Do you have friends that come occasionally, but strongly support our Latin Mass mission?

At the last parish council meeting, it was suggested that we should first ask God for help. With that in mind, I am inviting everyone to say a 54 Day Rosary Novena for our parish. It begins on All Souls Day Nov. 2nd and ends on December 25th. The three intentions for this 54 Day Rosary Novena are:

- Unity and growth in our parish.
- The financial needs of Transfiguration.
- Your specific intentions.

Thank you for considering these questions. We are aiming for \$8,000 per week. Mark your calendar for November 2 and let us make it a great 54 day rosary.
