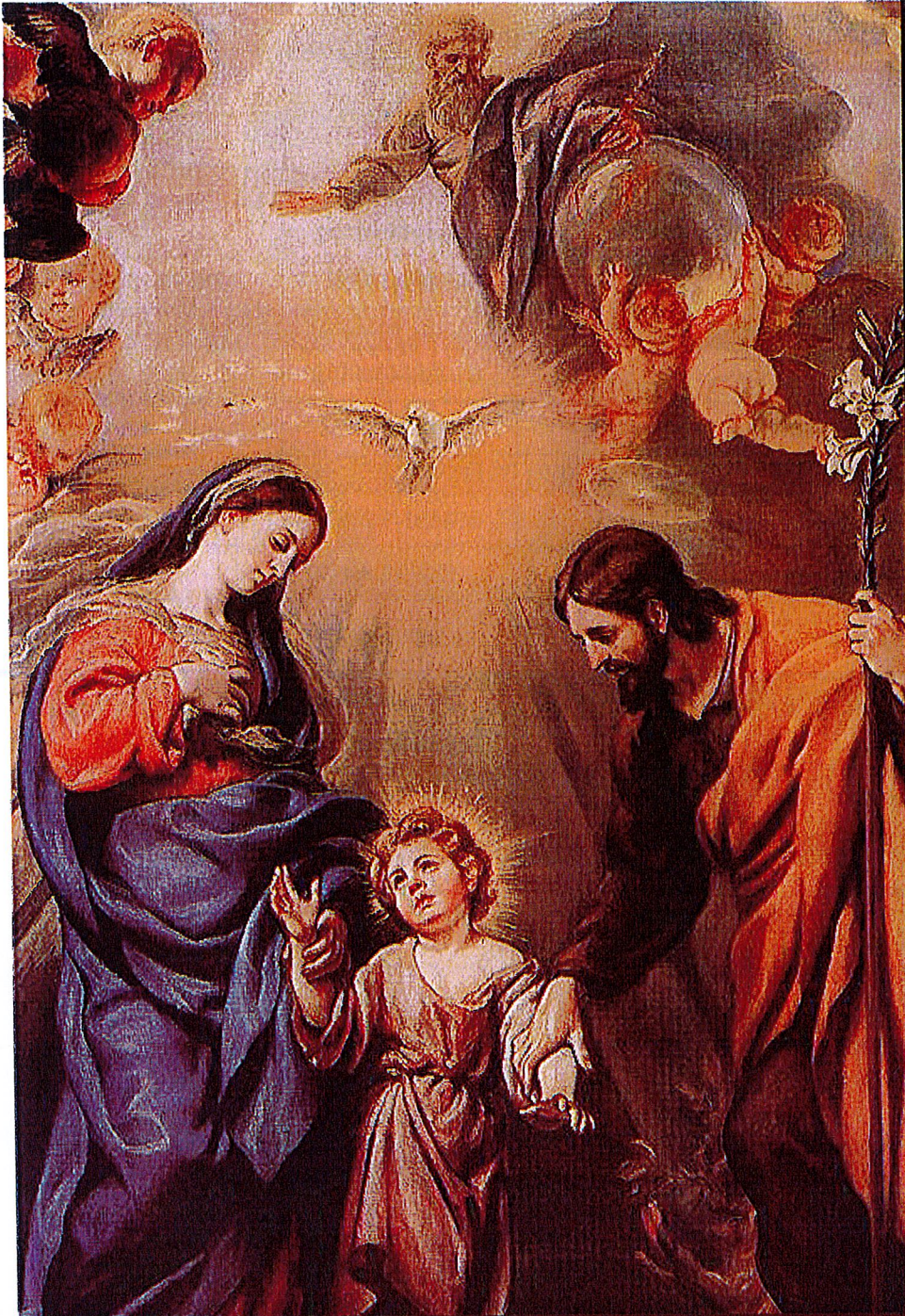

## CHAPTER 36 AGAINST THE VAIN JUDGMENTS OF MEN

*Taken from the Imitation of Christ for Fr. Belling:*

*Christ:* SON, cast thy heart firmly on the Lord, and fear not the judgment of man when thy conscience gives testimony of thy piety and innocence. It is good and happy to suffer in this manner, neither will this be grievous to a humble heart, nor to him that trusts in God more than in himself. Many say many things, and therefore little credit is to be given to them. ***Neither is it possible to satisfy all.*** Though Paul endeavored to please all in the Lord and made himself all unto all (1 Cor. 9:22), yet he made little account of his being judged by the judgment of men. (1 Cor. 4:3). 2. ***He labored for the edification and salvation of others as much as he could and as lay in him, but he could not prevent his being sometimes judged or despised by others.*** Therefore he committed all to God, who knows all, and defended himself, by patience and humility, ***against the tongues of those that spoke evil***, or that thought and gave out at pleasure vain and faulty things of him. However, he answered them sometimes, lest his silence might give occasion of scandal to the weak. 3. "Who art thou, that thou shouldst be afraid of a mortal man?" (Is. 51:12). Today he is, and tomorrow he appears no more. (1 Mach. 2:63). Fear God, and thou shalt have no need of being afraid of man. What can anyone do against thee by his words or injuries? He rather hurts himself than thee, nor can he escape the judgment of God whoever he be. (2 Mach. 7:35). See thou have God before thine eyes and do not contend with complaining words. (2 Tim. 2:14). And if at present thou seem to be overcome, and to suffer a confusion which ***thou hast not deserved***, do not repine at this and do not lessen thy crown by impatience. Rather look up to Me in Heaven, who am able to deliver thee from all confusion and wrong, and to repay everyone according to his works. (Matt. 16:27).

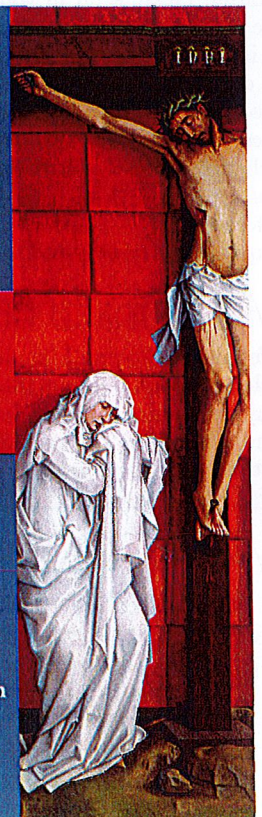

The Mass schedule will then be opened for each quarter and parishioners have another opportunity to request Masses each quarter. Please send in your 4 intentions/names for 2024 along with the dates and your Mass stipend, using the pew envelopes. Make sure to indicate living or deceased. We will do our best to fulfill your request as close to the requested date as possible. Dates can be selected from the entire year. Once parishioners have had an opportunity to submit these 4 intentions and they are added to the Mass book, the Mass Schedule will be opened again for the first quarter (January to April) and you will have another opportunity to have additional Masses offered, depending on availability. Use Pew envelopes for your mass requests. **Mass stipend is \$15.**
